The Chairman of the Equine Drugs and Medications Committee shall, upon consultation with staff, and within 60 days of receipt of laboratory results, make a determination in his or her discretion whether to recommend the issuance of charges by the Federation, whether to recommend a plea agreement, whether to impose administrative penalties, or whether to take no further action in the matter, and shall communicate that decision in writing to the Federation's CEO or Executive Director.
- 3. In the event the Chairman of the Equine Drugs and Medications Committee determines to impose administrative penalties in accordance with GR412.2, in lieu of a recommendation to issue charges, he or she shall be authorized to impose any or all of the penalties enumerated in Chapter 7, GR703, setting forth the terms and conditions for compliance. The trainer(s) and owner(s) shall after receiving written notice of the right to a hearing, after their written waiver of same, and written acceptance of an administrative penalty, be subject to any and all administrative penalties imposed by the Chairman of the Equine Drugs and Medications Committee.
- 4. The Federation shall give written notification to trainer(s) and owner(s) of administrative penalties determined pursuant to GR412.3 above, the terms and conditions of which shall not be subject to negotiation. Administrative penalties accepted in accordance with this Rule are subject to approval by the Hearing Committee. Once accepted by all parties and by the Hearing Committee, an administrative penalty shall have the same force and effect as would a finding of rule violation by the Hearing Committee following a hearing pursuant to Chapters 6 and 7, and shall be published in equestrian.

Any trainer(s), or owner(s), or both, who have received notice of an administrative penalty under GR412.4 and who have not accepted same in writing shall receive a hearing before the Hearing Committee, in accordance with Chapters 6 and 7. No part of the shoe may exceed the dimensions of 3/8" thick by 1 1/8" wide (nail heads and/or toe clips are not considered when measuring the shoe). The shoe may be of any type and configuration except in the case of a bar shoe, the bar may not extend below the ground surface of the shoe.
- 2. Maximum length of toe including pad is 4 3/4".
- 3. For purebred and Half Andalusian horses the use of any pad on a hoof is prohibited. The overall length of the toe measurement, including any shoe, (see GR510) shall not exceed the maximum toe length of 4 3/4". The introduction of a foreign material between the shoe and hoof is strictly prohibited.
- 4. At the discretion of a judge or a steward officiating at a licensed Andalusian Competition, or at the request of the Show Committee (See GR1201), inspection (including measuring the shoe, presence of a pad, and measurement of hoof length) may be required. Shoes and pads, if present, cast after entering or before exiting the arena in any class shall be inspected.
  - a. A random inspection of horses at all National, Regional and qualifying shows (wearing pads) may be required. Said inspection shall be performed by a licensed steward or judge designated by the Show Committee (The Show Committee may, at its discretion designate more than one licensed official to perform inspections). Any trainer, exhibitor and/or agent of a horse subject to the inspection each may request to be present and heard while said inspection is being performed by said licensed official(s). Prior to any dis-qualification and/or other penalties imposed on a horse at a competition, the inspecting officials shall make reasonable efforts to notify and have present the owner(s), and trainer(s) of said horse, or agent(s) at the inspection.

The inspecting officials shall take possession of any shoe, and/or pad and measure the shoe with a USEF approved shoe gauge. Measurement of hoof length shall be made in accordance with GR510. In the event that the inspecting officials find a violation of the shoe measurement, hoof length, and/or pad presence the horse shall be disqualified for the entire competition, and the owner shall be required to forfeit all prize money, sweepstakes, futurity and trophies, entry fees, ribbons and points won at said competition by said horse. Additionally, if any forbidden foreign material is found on the hoof between the pad and/or shoe, or pad and hoof, within the pad, and /or the pad composition is in violation, the steward shall file a charge against the trainer(s) and/or owners with the Federation Hearing Committee in accordance with the General Rules. The trainer and/or owner of a horse found to be shod with any forbidden material as described is subject to whatever penalty or penalties are assessed through the charge process.

## SUBCHAPTER MH-1 GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS

## MH101 Eligibility to Compete

- 1. All entries must be registered with the American Miniature Horse Registry (AMHR). No animal will be allowed to compete or be measured unless the exhibitor can show the original registration paper or a photo static copy of same to the competition secretary.
- 2. Horses must be entered under the full registered name and registration number of the animal as it is shown on the horse's registration certificate. No substitutions or changes are acceptable.
- 3. No horse shall be allowed to compete at a licensed competition unless the exhibitor can provide current height verification to the competition secretary.
- 4. Youth 17 and Under
  - a. Youth 13 17 may show senior stallions (3 years or older) in youth performance and youth driving classes.
  - b. Youth 13 years of age or older may show a stallion in Open Halter and Performance classes.
  - c. Youth under 13 may not show stallions of any age, including junior stallions (weanlings, yearlings, or 2 year olds).
- 5. Amateur (GR1306)-Horses shown in the Amateur division must be owned or leased by the amateur or the family of that amateur.
- 6. Adults must be 18 years and older. (GR101)
- 7. Ladies must be 18 years and older.
- 8. Gentlemen must be 18 years and older.
- 9. Golden Age must be 55 years old or older.
- 10. Cross-entering between Shetland and Miniature classes is not allowed at the same competition.

## MH102 Breed Standard and General Specifications

- 1. General Impression: A small, sound, well-balanced horse which gives the impression of strength, agility and alertness. The disposition should be eager and friendly, not skittish.
- 2. Size: The American Miniature Horse must measure not more than 34 inches at the base of the last hair on the mane for Under Section, and not more than 38 inches for Over Section. Since the breed objective is the smallest possible perfect horse, preference in judging shall be given to the smallest, if all other factors are equal. In no case shall a smaller horse be placed over a larger horse with better conformation.
- 3. Head: In proportion to the body; neither excessively long nor short. The eyes should be large, alert, and prominent with no discrimination in color. The ears are open toward the front and carried erect. The teeth should show no signs of parrot mouth or undershot jaw.
- 4. Neck: Strong and muscular, proportionate to body and the type of horse represented.
- 5. Body: Well-muscled with good bone and substance, well sprung ribs, level topline, as nearly as possible of equal height in withers and rump, fore and hind quarters well angulated, so that the horse in movement shows a smooth gait.
- 6. Legs: Straight, clean and sound.
- 7. Hooves: Round and compact, trimmed as short as practical for an unshod horse, and in good condition.
- 8. Color: Any color, eye color and/or marking pattern is equally acceptable.
- 9. Throat-Latch: Clean and well defined, allowing ample flexion at the poll.
- 10. Shoulder: Long, sloping and well-angulated, allowing a free swinging stride and alert head/neck carriage. Well muscled forearm.
- 11. Hindquarters: Long, well-muscled hip, thigh and gaskin. Highest point of croup should be same height as withers. Tail-set should be neither excessively high nor low, but smoothly rounding off rump.
- 12. Animals with complete loss of sight in either eye may be found serviceably sound at the Judge's discretion. (GR841)

- 13. Priority in judging shall be in this order:
  - a. Soundness
  - b. Balance and conformity to the breed standard
  - c. Size
- 14. Disqualifications:
  - a. Height in excess of 34 inches for Under Section
  - b. Height in excess of 38 inches for Over Section miniatures
  - c. Dwarfism
  - d. Unsoundness
  - e. Cryptorchidism in aged stallions.
- 15. Horse shall show with full mane and tail (no full roach). Mane and tail length shall be left to the decision and discretion of the exhibitor. Thinning, pulling, shortening, etc., of a mane and tail is permissible.

#### MH103 Artificial Appliances, Shoeing, and Irritants

- 1. Any horse showing evidence of the use of ginger or other irritants to produce a higher tail carriage than normal shall be disqualified by the judge.
- 2. Switches, artificial tails or manes, and high spoon cruppers are prohibited.
  - a. Exception: Switches and artificial tails are optional in Park Harness
- 3. No horse having had surgery for purely cosmetic purposes will be permitted to compete. (Example: ear trimming, ear wiring, docked tails, etc.)
- 4. Ribbons, braids, all decorative appurtenances and stallion tack in halter conformation classes are not allowed unless otherwise specified in USEF class description. Bits are allowed on stallions.
- 5. Shod horses are not allowed on the competition grounds. No pads, wedges, chains, or ankle boots are allowed to be used on the grounds of an USEF/AMHR licensed competition.
  - a. Exceptions:
    - (1) Horses shown in Draft harness classes may be shod with light plate shoes or draft type shoes with toe and heel caulks.
    - (2) Horses shown only in Roadster classes have the option of wearing un-weighted bell type boots.
    - (3) Horses shown in Roman Chariot Event classes may be shod with light plate shoes.
- 6. Leg bandages are allowed in Hunter and Jumper classes.

#### MH104 Conduct and Specifications

- 1. Dress: It is the tradition of the show ring that handlers and drivers be correctly attired for their classes. (T-shirts, shorts, clothes with logos or monograms are not correct attire and will not be allowed in the show ring. No farm, individual or horse's names or logos may be displayed on exhibitor.) Horse and handler must look their best. In all showmanship classes, boots, hats, gloves and long sleeve shirts or jackets are mandatory.
- 2. A horse must be handled and shown through an entire class by the same person. Should an additional handler be required due to physical limitation or emergency, approval must be obtained from competition management.
- 3. Electronic communication devices used for the purpose of coaching, etc., between competitors and individuals outside the ring, shall be prohibited in all classes in the Miniature Horse Division. Exempt from this rule are handicapped riders who have submitted written proof to the Federation steward.

SUBCHAPTER MH-2

MEASUREMENT

#### MH106 General Rules

- 1. Exhibitors must carry a current AMHR measurement card or 60 day measurement form for each horse and present to competition management before back numbers will be issued.
- 2. Exhibitors not in possession of either of the above must have the USEF steward perform a day measurement at that competition before the horse may be shown
  - a. Stewards must use an official certified AMHR measuring device and record the number of the device on the measurement form. Only devices certified by AMHR may be used for official measuring of miniature horses.
  - b. Horses may be measured shod or unshod
  - c. If a horse is measured into a different height division than it is entered, the horse is to be shown in the new height division without additional cost or penalty to the exhibitor.
  - e. Management has the authority to bar a horse from competing if the owner or agent refuses to have the horse measured.
  - f. Competitions offering Miniature Horse classes will be provided an AMHR Approved Measurement device by the Federation; to be returned to the Federation offices at the completion of the competition.

#### MH107 Measurement Protocol

- 1. In measuring a miniature horse, the head is to be in a normal position.
  - a. Measure the vertical distance from the base of the last hair on the mane to the measuring surface.
  - b. The crosspiece, arm or bar must have firm contact with the animal but no additional pressure may be applied.
- 2. Measurements are to be recorded to the nearest ¼ inch, unless over the required measurement for that division.
- 3. The Steward should measure the animal and record the height measurement on the accurately completed form.
- 4. The exhibitor should be made aware by the Steward that measurement was for the purpose of that competition only and the horse must be officially measured and issued an AMHR measurement card for future USEF competitions.
- 5. If a miniature horse is measured and found to be over 38 inches the Steward shall not allow the horse to compete and shall notify the USEF and AMHR of such findings.
- 6. In the event of a protest regarding measurement, the Steward will perform a measurement to verify measurement on the card. If the measurement does not match the official AMHR measurement card, said measurement card must be surrendered to the Steward who will forward it to USEF and AMHR for further processing. The horse will not be allowed to compete further until receiving a new AMHR measurement card.

#### MH108 Measuring Surface

- 1. The measuring area must be a solid surface and must be level; under no circumstances should animals be measured on dirt or gravel.
- 2. A concrete slab or other paved surface is most desirable, but when not available, a 4'x 8' sheet of ½ inch or thicker plywood, placed directly on level ground, can be used as an alternative measuring surface. Under no circumstances should the plywood be placed on a frame or raised off the ground.

## MH109 Position of Animal

The animal must be standing squarely on all four feet and should not be permitted to "stretch". The front legs should be on a vertical line directly under the shoulder. The back of the hocks should be in a vertical line with the animal's buttocks. The miniature horse's head must be held low enough to reveal the highest point of the withers and no lower. The animal must be free of blanket, hood, neck wrap and tail set to compare the description on the registration paper to the animal being measured. The handler must not interfere with the animal in any way that will prevent it from standing in this position.

SUBCHAPTER MH-3 HALTER

#### MH110 General

- 1. Horses may be clipped or shown in full coats.
- 2. Horses may be shown with or without polished hooves.
- 3. Horses must be serviceably sound, in good condition, and well-groomed. Transmissible weakness and unsoundness to be penalized.
- 4. Combining sexes in the same class is forbidden in breeding halter classes.
- 5. Equipment
  - a. Any type halter is permissible.
  - b. No whips and/or crops are allowed
  - c. The bitting of stallions is permitted, but no stallion tack is allowed.
- 6. Changing the coat color of a horse is not permitted but highlighting the mane and tail, and around the eyes, ears, muzzle, etc., is permissible.
- 7. AMHR papers for Geldings must have been changed from Stallion to Gelding to be eligible to show.
- 8. Except in Mare and Foal class, a broodmare shall not be allowed in the show ring when her foal is being exhibited and a foal shall not be allowed in the show ring when his/her dam is being exhibited.
- 9. In all group classes (Get of Sire, Produce of Dam, Mare and Foal, Herd of Four, etc.), horses shall be judged standing still. Horses are not to be asked to move.

### MH111 Class Specifications

- 1. Horses to be shown in halter at a walk and trot. The judge must ask for the horse to walk past them and then trot away. The judge must also ask for the horse to trot away and make an L turn to enable the Judge to view the movement of the horse from the side.
- 2. The Miniature Horse is to be shown to its best advantage. It is preferred the horse stand square. The judge may ask to have the horse stand square (all four feet flat on the ground and at least one front and one rear cannon bone perpendicular to the ground)
- 3. MODEL STALLIONS, MARES, GELDINGS: Shall be the first class shown for that sex. Judged 100% on conformation. Horses are never asked to move. Horses entered in a model class must be at least two years old.
- 4. BROODMARES 3 YEARS OLD AND OLDER, FOAL AT SIDE (WET): May be shown in either Aged class or Broodmare class. First and second place Broodmares are eligible for the Senior Mare Championship class. If a mare is Placed Senior Champion or Reserve, she is then qualified for the Grand Champion and Reserve class.
- 5. OWNED, BRED, AND SHOWN BY EXHIBITOR: Exhibitor must be listed as the owner and breeder on the registration papers to show a horse in this class

#### 6. YOUTH HALTER

- a. All youth classes may be split: 7 years and under, 8-12 years, and 13-17 years; or 12 years and under, and 13-17 years.
- b. Open to miniature mare or gelding, any age, shown by a youth. To be judged on breed, character, conformation, performance, quality, and manners. The exhibitor is to have complete control of the horse throughout the class.
  - (1) For Youth ages 7 & under spotters are permitted, but are there only for safety and must stand two paces from the child and horse.

#### SUBCHAPTER MH-4 DRIVING

#### MH112 General

- 1. The driving section was founded for the purpose of developing and furthering the art and sport of driving for pleasure. A complete knowledge of and compliance with the rules are essential.
- 2. All driving horses must be at least 3 years old.
- 3. Stallions may be driven in all classes.

- 4. Attire: Headers, drivers, and passengers should be dressed appropriately. Dress in the show ring is to complement the overall appearance of the unit, not detract. Horses are being shown, not the driver.
  - a. No strapless dresses in any driving class.
  - b. No sandals or open toed shoes to be worn by driver or header.
  - c. No T-shirts or shorts.
  - d. No farm, individual, or animal names or logos may be displayed.
    - (1) Exception: Draft harness classes.
- 5. Horse and Equipment:
  - a. Horses must be serviceably sound.
  - b. Horses must show with full manes and tails.
  - c. Boots, wraps, etc. of any description are prohibited.
  - (1) Exception: In Roadster classes un-weighted bell type boots are optional.
  - d. Driving whips, if used, must be of suitable style, and the tip of the lash must not reach past the shoulder of the horse.
- 6. Stake classes will be known as Championship classes. First place will be Champion and second place will be Reserve Champion. Stake classes will be placed through fifth place.
  - a. A horse must have been entered, shown, and judged in a qualifying class in order to participate in the corresponding stake class. Example: To show in the Roadster Stake, the horse must show in another roadster class, and cannot qualify for the Roadster Stake by showing in a pleasure class.
- 7. Roman Chariot Event is an optional class and should be judged as a costume driving class, not as a race.
- 8. Cross Entering:
  - a. Pleasure horses cannot cross-enter into Country Pleasure or Park Divisions at the same show.
  - b. Country Pleasure horses cannot cross-enter into Pleasure or Park Divisions at the same show.
  - c. Park horses cannot cross-enter into Pleasure or Country Pleasure at the same show.
  - d. Pleasure, Country Pleasure, and Park horses can enter Roadster Division at the same show.
  - e. The Western Country Pleasure Driving horse may not cross enter into the Country Pleasure, Pleasure Driving, or Park Harness at the same show.
- 9. Division of Classes: Classes in all sections of pleasure driving competitions may be offered for singles, pairs, tandem, unicorns, four-inhand and etc.
  - a. Open no age restriction on drivers or horses, all sexes (except for Youth).
    - (1) Open classes may be divided by height within each section
  - b. Adults
  - c. Ladies
  - d. Gentlemen
  - e. Mares, Stallions, Geldings
  - f. Height: 32" and under, over 32"-34", and over 34"-38"
  - g. Youth
  - h. Amateur
  - i. Maiden Horses
  - j. Novice Driver or Horse
  - k. Limit Driver or Horse

## MH113 Conduct

- 1. The only person to handle the reins, under penalty of elimination, is the driver. No change of driver is permitted during any class.
- 2. In Youth Driving, an attendant is allowed in the vehicle with the youth, but not required. The youth shall be in full control of the horse without assistance.
- 3. Exhibitor numbers may be worn on the back of the exhibitor or attached to the back of cart in an easily visible position for Pleasure Driving, Country Pleasure Driving, and Park divisions. Number must be worn on the back of the exhibitor in the Roadster section.
- 4. It is permissible for a driver to talk to a horse in a subdued tone of voice, although a driver should strive to control the horse's movement with a minimum of vocal aids. Talking loud, whistling, or shouting at a horse is not acceptable.

MH114 Safety

- 1. All persons involved in driving drivers, grooms, competition officials, spectators, etc., should place safety first.
- 2. Horses must never be left unattended while hitched to a vehicle.
- 3. A driver must never allow passengers to enter a vehicle until the driver is seated with reins in hand and the driver must never dismount while passengers are in the vehicle.
- 4. Headers (16 years old or older) are required in all youth driving classes. Headers are to enter the ring when the line-up is called, may assist in setting up the animal, and then step back two paces where they are to remain, except in an emergency, until the Judge's card is turned in.
- 5. Headers are optional in non-youth driving classes.
- 6. All rules of the road should be observed unless officials direct otherwise.
- 7. As conditions warrant, excessively large classes may be divided by management or judge.
- 8. All driving horses shall show on the rail at all times except while passing. Horses shown off the rail shall be penalized.
- 9. If the class or ring size justifies, the judge may ask the horses to reverse on the diagonal at a walk or collected trot.
- 10. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (Certified ASTM/SEI) in any division or class without penalty from the judge. All youth MUST wear protective headgear (Certified ASTM/SEI) in Roadster. Headgear harness must be secured and properly fitted.

#### MH115 Pleasure Driving

- 1. Equipment and Attire
  - a. All pleasure driving vehicles must be of the two wheel type and have a basket. Undue noise created by a vehicle will be a reason to excuse the entry from the ring.
  - b. Harness in the pleasure division must be of the light type with breast collars. No full hames allowed. Round or square blinkers are permissible in pleasure classes. Side or over-checks are required. When shown, the horse must wear blinders and the check must be hooked. No other appliances may be used on a driving horse other than the harness. (Example: no fly nets on the ears, face, or body).
  - c. Bits in the pleasure driving division shall be of the snaffle type. No Liverpool bits, curb chains or curb straps are allowed.
  - d. Martingales are optional.
  - e. Check bits are optional.
  - f. Braids matching the stable colors, one in the foretop and one immediately back of the bridle path as seen on the larger pleasure driving horses are optional.
  - g. Formal wear should not be worn before 5 p.m. unless stake classes are held in an afternoon performance session.
- 2. Class Specifications
  - a. Pleasure driving horses are to enter the ring counter-clockwise (to the right) at a pleasure trot. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, pleasure trot, and extended trot. To stand quietly and rein back.
  - b. To be judged 60% on performance, manners and way of going; 30% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness, appropriateness of attire, and overall impression.
  - c. Excessive speed will be penalized.
- 3. Gait Requirements
  - a. Walk: A free, regular and forward moving 4-beat gait. The horse should walk energetically, but calmly, with an even and determined pace.
  - b. Pleasure Trot: The horse should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. The trot is slower and more collected, but the horse should indicate willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence.
  - c. Extended Trot: A clear, but not excessive, increase in gait and length of stride. The horse goes forward freely, engaging the hind legs with good hock action, on a taut but light rein, the position balanced and unconstrained.

### MH116 Country Pleasure Driving

#### 1. Equipment and Attire

- a. Country Pleasure driving is to be shown to a two wheel cart only. Bike tires or wooden wheels are permissible.
- b. Harness in the country pleasure division must be of the light type. Breastcollars or light collars are permissible, but no full hames allowed. Breeching is optional. Side or over-checks are required. When shown, the horse must have blinkers (round or square) and the check must be hooked. No other appliances may be used on a driving horse other than the harness. (Example: no fly nets on the ears, face, or body).
- c. Bits in the pleasure driving division shall be of the snaffle type. No Liverpool bits, curb chains or curb straps are allowed.
- d. Martingales are optional.
- e. Check bits are optional.
- 2. Class Specifications
  - a. Country Pleasure Driving horses are to enter the ring counterclockwise (to the right) at a country pleasure trot. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, country pleasure trot and an extended trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged 60% on performance, manners and way of going, 30% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, and 10% on neatness, appropriateness of attire and overall impression. Overchecks and side checks should be slightly loose, not snug. The head set should appear natural for the horse. Excessive knee action and speed to be penalized.
- 3. Gait Requirements
  - a. Walk: A free, regular and forward moving four beat gait. The horse should walk energetically, but calmly, with an even and determined gait.
  - b. Country Pleasure Trot: A balanced, easy moving, relaxed two beat gait demonstrating forward movement.
  - c. Extended Trot: A clear increase in gait and length of stride. The horse should move freely on a taut, but light rein, while maintaining a balanced gait and forward movement. Excessive knee action and speed shall be penalized.

## MH117 Western Country Pleasure Driving

- 1. A Western Country Pleasure Driving horse should carry himself in a natural balanced position with a relaxed head and neck. His poll should be level with, or slightly above the level of the withers.
- 2. Equipment.
  - a. Harness must be of the light type. Breastcollars or light collars are permissible, but no full hames are allowed. Breeching is optional. Side or over checks are required. When shown, the horse must have blinders (round or square) and the check must be hooked. No other appliances may be used on a driving horse other than the harness. (Example: no fly nets on the ears, face, or body).
  - b. Overchecks and side checks should be slightly loose, not snug.
  - c. Bits shall be of the snaffle type. No Liverpool bits, curb chains, or curb straps are allowed.
  - d. Martingales and check bits are optional.
- 3. Class Specifications
  - a. Horses shall enter the ring counterclockwise (to the right) at a Country Pleasure Trot. All horses are to be shown both ways of the arena at a Walk, Country Pleasure Trot and Extended Trot. All gaits to be performed in a smooth, relaxed, balanced manner. Consistently showing too far off the rail and excessive noisemaking by exhibitors during the class shall be penalized according to severity. Each horse shall be required to back readily and straight and stand quietly.
  - b. To be judged 60 percent on the horse's performance, manners and way of going, and suitability for assuring a pleasurable drive, 30 percent on condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, and 10 percent on neatness, appropriateness of attire and overall impression. Excessive knee action and speed to be penalized.
  - c. Maximum credit should be given to a horse with a relaxed head and neck, that carries his poll level with, or slightly above the withers, moves straight, with low strides and with little flexion of knees and hocks, with free movement, manners and a bright expression.
  - d. The horse shall be severely penalized if his poll is more than 5 inches above the level of the withers, is behind the vertical, is overflexed, excessively nosed out, the poll is below the withers, exhibits excessive speed or shows lack of control by the exhibitor.

## 4. Gaits

- a. Walk: A free regular and forward moving four beat gait. The horse should walk freely and calmly, with an even determined gait.
- b. Country Pleasure Trot: A balanced, easy going, relaxed two beat gait demonstrating forward movement with a flat knee and little hock flexion.
- c. Extended Trot: A clear increase in gait and length of stride. The horse should move freely on a taut, but light rein, while maintaining a balanced gait and forward movement with low strides and little flexion of knees and hocks.

#### 5. Attire

- a. Ladies may wear jackets and blouses with slacks and skirts or dresses. No bare shoulders. Hats are optional.
- b. Gentlemen should wear western attire with or without a western hat.

#### MH118 Roadster

- 1. The roadster horse may be of any type, any color of attractive appearance, balanced in conformation, and with manners which make a safe risk in the ring.
- 2. Horses shall be serviceably sound.
- 3. The principal gait for the roadster the trot. Horses shall be asked to trot at three different speeds: the slow jog trot, the faster road gait, and at a full extended "drive on" trot.
- 4. Class Specifications: Roadsters must enter the ring clockwise (to the left) at a jog trot; then show at the jog trot and road gait; reverse, jog trot, road gait and trot at speed. At speed, horse should work in form. Breaks should not be penalized in a horse that demonstrated three distinct trots over a horse that has not demonstrated gait distinction. Performance at all three gaits should be strongly considered. When horses are in the line driver shall not leave vehicle except for necessary adjustments. Headers are allowed in the ring for roadster classes. Horses must not be asked to rein back.
- 5. Horses should be shown on the rail at all times except when passing. Showing off the rail shall be penalized.
- 6. Harness shall be appropriate to the vehicle. Martingales are optional. No Liverpool bits are allowed. Harness must have blinkers and have either side check or over-check. The check must be used and be hooked. Harness must be of the light type with breastcollar.
- 7. Horse shall be shown to a bike (a two-wheeled cart with stirrups and no basket). Road bikes with tire guards closed wheel/arch) are mandatory.
- 8. Equipment and Attire:
  - a. Exhibitors are required to wear stable colors, cap and jacket to match, of the type found on the trotting tracks of America. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty.
  - b. Braids, matching the stable colors, one in the foretop and one immediately back of the bridle path as seen on the larger roadster horses are optional.
  - c. The exhibitor number must be worn on the exhibitor's back. An optional supplementary number can be placed on the shafts.
  - d. Un-weighted bell type boots are optional.
  - e. All youth must wear protective headgear (Certified ASTM/SEI) in Roadster classes. Headgear harness must be secured and properly fitted.

#### MH119 Draft Harness

- 1. Classes may be offered for singles, pairs, tandem, unicorns, four-, six- and eight-in-hand.
- 2. Equipment and Attire
  - a. Horses must be shown hitched to a suitable 4 wheeled vehicle, except that a cart may be used for single or tandem.
  - b. All horses must be harnessed with heavy harness (collar with full hames and breeching). The wagon and/or harness may display the owners name, advertising, logo, monograms etc.
  - c. Braiding of tails and manes in the style used by the larger heavy harness breeds may be used. Docking is optional.
  - d. Shoeing and bits similar to the type used by the larger heavy harness breeds are permissible.
- 3. Class Specifications
  - a. Horses to be shown both ways of the ring at a natural walk and trot. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily, will be worked in a figure eight, right and left. Tandem and unicorn to be worked at the judge's discretion. Headers (16 years of age and older) may be used for safety.
- 4. Draft driving classes may be divided in the same fashion as in the pleasure driving section.

#### MH120 Fine Harness

- 1. Classes may be offered for singles, pairs, tandems, unicorns, four-in-hand, six-in-hand, or more.
- 2. Cross-entering between Fine Harness and Pleasure Driving classes will not be allowed at the same competition.
- 3. Hitches are to enter the show ring at a trot going counter-clockwise (to the right). The horses should be judged both way of the arena, showing at a trot and a flat footed walk. Horses are to stand quietly and rein back at the discretion of the judge.
- 4. Equipment and Attire
  - a. Horses must be harnessed in fine harness with breast collar or full collar (no full hames or britching) and shown to an appropriate vehicle.
  - b. In tandem classes, whip length should be long enough to touch the front horse.

#### MH121 Park Harness

- 1. The horse is to give a brilliant performance with style, presence, finish, balance and cadence.
- 2. Equipment and Attire
  - a. Park horse is to be neatly trimmed, well groomed, braided with one braid in the foretop and one immediately back of the bridle path. Tail braces and false tails are optional.
  - b. Harness should be of the type used to show in the pleasure division.
  - c. Martingales are optional.
  - d. Park harness horses are shown to a viceroy or a two wheeled vehicle.
- 3. Horses may not be cross entered between the Park Harness, Pleasure, and Country Pleasure sections at the same competition.
- 4. Park horses are to enter the show ring at a trot going counter-clockwise (to the right) and be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and park trot. Park horses are not asked to back. To be judged on brilliant performance, presence, quality, manners and conformation.
  - a. Walk: An animated walk is required. The motion should be brisk and vigorous with the horse showing animation and brilliance.
  - b. Park Trot: Extremely animated, cadenced trot, with impulsion and power. The trot is bold and brilliant with knees and hocks snapping high in expansive and dramatic style, creating an illusion of lightness with high-stepping action. Excessive speed shall be penalized.

## MH122 Obstacle Driving

#### 1. General:

- a. The obstacle course must be posted at the Competition Office not less than two hours prior to the class.
- b. Horses must be at least three years old for obstacle driving.
- c. No one may show before a judge in classes where the exhibitor has designed the course in that class.
- d. A horse can only be shown by one exhibitor per class and each exhibitor may show only one horse per class.
- e. All obstacles must be numbered on the course in order of driving sequence.
- f. In competitions where more than one obstacle class is offered at least three of the obstacles must be different or the manner of performance through obstacles must be varied for the class.
- g. Edible treats to encourage an animal to perform one of the obstacles are not allowed.
- h. All obstacles should be safe for exhibitors as well as for horses.
- i. Horses shall be shown in a suitable two-wheeled cart with basket.
- j. Attendants 16 years of age and older, may be allowed in the ring during Youth Obstacle Driving for safety purposes only. Attendant must not interfere with or influence individual's or equine's performance.
- 2. Class Specifications
  - a. Classes will be judged 100% on the manner of horse's performance through the course.
  - b. There is a sixty second time limit to complete each obstacle. After time is used, the exhibitor will be directed to the next obstacle.
  - c. Refusal of three (3) obstacles shall be cause for disqualification.
  - d. Cantering is penalized in obstacle driving.

- e. Obstacle requirements:
  - (1) Must be a minimum of five and maximum of eight obstacles.
  - (2) Tires and stair steps are prohibited.
  - (3) Jumps are prohibited.
- f. Off course will result in elimination from the class and no points, ribbons or awards will be presented/disqualification. It is to be the judge's discretion to disqualify.
- g. Off course is defined as:
  - (1) Taking an obstacle in the wrong direction.
  - (2) Negotiating an obstacle from the wrong side.
  - (3) Skipping an obstacle unless directed by the judge
  - (4) Negotiating obstacles in the wrong sequence.
  - (5) No physically moving, or coercing the horse by touching.
  - (6) Leaving the obstacle course.

#### SUBCHAPTER MH-5 JUMPER & HUNTER

#### MH123 General

- 1. Courses must be posted at least two hours prior to the scheduled time of the class. Course diagrams must show, with arrows, the direction each obstacle must be taken, and markers or a line must indicate the start and finish of the course.
- 2. Horses must be at least three years old.
- 3. The handler cannot jump the course with the horse.
- 4. May show with braided manes and tails in the manner of their larger counterparts.
- 5. The Judge(s) and Steward shall walk the course with the Course Designer and exhibitors prior to the start of the class.
- 6. Jumps
  - a. There will be a minimum of four fences and a maximum of six fences.
  - b. The fences can range in height from twelve to twenty-four inches (in the jump-off this will change to a minimum of twelve to a maximum of thirty inches). All jumps must be at least five feet to six feet in width, with a minimum of twenty feet between jumps, except for In and Outs.
  - c. Jumps should be of attractive design but constructed of a material so as not to cause danger to the horse.
  - d. All jumps must have a ground pole.
  - e. Jump standards may not be higher than 40". No wings or additions are allowed outside the jump standards.
  - f. All jumps used in performance classes must be collapsible.
  - g. An In and Out jump is considered one obstacle and scored as such. Refusal of one element of an In and Out requires the retaking of both elements. The distance between the two jumps in an In and Out should be 10-12 feet. An In and Out should never be the first jump in the course.
- 7. Knockdown: an obstacle is considered knocked down when in jumping an obstacle, a horse or handler, by contact, lowers the established height of the fence in any way.
- 8. Refusal: stopping at an obstacle without knocking it down and without backing, followed by jumping from a standstill is not penalized. However, if the halt continues or if the horse backs even a single step, side steps or circles to retake the fence, a refusal is incurred.
- 9. Circling: any form of circle or circles whereby the horse crosses its original track between two consecutive obstacles, stops advancing toward the next obstacle, or turns away from the next obstacle, except to retake an obstacle after a disobedience.

#### MH124 Jumpers

- 1. Whips may be carried in all jumper classes.
- 2. Faults and Scoring
  - a. Jumpers are judged on accumulated faults only.
  - b. Knockdown..... 4 faults
  - c. Refusals

1st refusal......4 faults
2nd refusal.....4 faults
3rd refusal.....Elimination

- d. Crossing your own path... 3 faults
- e. Elimination:
  - (1) Three (3) refusals
- (2) Off course
- (3) Fall of horse and/or exhibitor
- f. Jump-Off
  - (1) In the event of a tie, a jump-off will be held over the original course.
  - (2) The height of the jumps shall be increased not less than one inch and not more than six inches in height.
    - (a) Only two jumps will be raised in height.
  - (3) The jump-off will be timed by a stopwatch and the horse which has the fastest time and the fewest faults in the jump off round will be declared the winner.
  - (4) An elimination in a jump-off does not eliminate the horse from the final placings.

#### MH125 Hunters

- 1. Hunters are to be judged on style, manners, and way of going, with preference given to those horses who cover the course at an even pace, with free flowing strides, as in a brisk trot or canter, but must maintain same gait throughout the entire course. Charging fences, or not maintaining the same gait throughout the entire class should be penalized.
- 2. Circling once upon entering the ring and once upon leaving the ring is permissible.
- 3. Upon completion of the entire class over jumps finalists will be jogged past the judge(s) for soundness. Any unsound horse will be eliminated. Horses shall not be required to re-jump the course.
- 4. Fences should simulate those found in hunting, such as natural post and rail, brush, stone wall, white board gate, hedge, oxer, etc.
- 5. Whips may not be carried.
- 6. Scoring
  - a. Elimination
  - (1) Three (3) refusals
  - (2) Off Course
  - (3) Crossing your own path (as in circling between fences, not as in retaking a fence from a refusal or when following a course design).
  - (4) Fall of horse or exhibitor
  - (5) Jumping of obstacle by exhibitor
  - (6) Carrying a whip
  - (7) An unsound horse
  - b. Major Faults
  - (1) Knockdowns
  - (2) Touches
  - (3) Refusals
  - (4) Bucking or Kicking
  - (5) Spooking or shying
  - (6) Wringing of tail
  - (7) Showing an obstacle to horses
  - (8) Not maintaining an even pace

#### SUBCHAPTER MH-6

OTHER PERFORMANCE CLASSES

#### MH126 Obstacle Halter

#### 1. General:

- a. The obstacle course must be posted at the Competition Office not less than two hours prior to the class.
- b. Horses must be at least one year old.
- c. No one may show before a judge in classes where the exhibitor has designed the course in that class.
- d. A horse can only be shown by one exhibitor per class and each exhibitor may show only one horse per class.
- e. All obstacles must be numbered on the course in order of sequence.
- f. In competitions where more than one obstacle class is offered at least three of the obstacles must be different or the manner of performance through obstacles must be varied for the class.
- g. Edible treats to encourage an animal to perform one of the obstacles are not allowed.
- h. All obstacles should be safe for exhibitors as well as for horses.
- i. Attendants 16 years of age and older, may be allowed in the ring during Youth Halter Obstacle for safety purposes only. Attendant must not interfere with or influence individual's or equine's performance.
- 2. Class Specifications
  - a. Classes will be judged 100% on the manner of horse's performance through the course.
  - b. There is a sixty second time limit to complete each obstacle. After time is used, the exhibitor will be directed to the next obstacle.
  - c. Refusal of three (3) obstacles shall be cause for disqualification.
  - d. Obstacle requirements:
    - (1) Must be a minimum of five and maximum of eightobstacles.
  - (2) Tires and stair steps are prohibited.
  - (3) Jumps are prohibited.
  - e. Off course will result in elimination from the class and no points, ribbons or awards will be presented/disqualification. It is to be the judge's discretion to disqualify.

### f. Off course is defined as:

- (1) Taking an obstacle in the wrong direction.
- (2) Negotiating an obstacle from the wrong side.
- (3) Skipping an obstacle unless directed by the judge
- (4) Negotiating obstacles in the wrong sequence.
- (5) No physically moving, or coercing the horse by touching.
- (6) Miniature leaving the obstacle course.

#### MH127 Liberty Class

1. Liberty is demonstrating the natural beauty of the miniature horse. Horses are to be judged on style, grace, animation, gaits, presence, and ease of catching. The liberty horse is expected to perform at both a canter and a trot.

#### 2. Time

- a. It is the responsibility of the ring master to time Liberty classes and to be in possession of a stopwatch.
- b. Timing will begin when the halter is dropped (not when the music starts) and the show announcer will announce TIME when the 11/2 minutes performance time has ended to signal the exhibitor that they can begin the catch. Continue to time the catch. When the 2 minute catch time has elapsed, the show announcer will announce TIME to signal the end of the catch if the animal has not been caught.
- c. If the catch is not completed in the 2 minute allotted time frame, the exhibitor is disqualified.
- 3. Only the exhibitor and one assistant will be allowed in the arena with the horse. Whips and shaker bottles are allowed, but touching the horse with aids or hands will result in disqualification.
- 4. Only the exhibitor or his assistant can touch the horse during the catch. The horse must be caught and haltered by the exhibitor only within 2 minutes or be disqualified. The assistant may not touch the horse at any time. 5. Music is required.
- 6. No deliberate interference with the horse from outside the ring. An announcement should be made prior to the class that no outside assistance is allowed.
- 7. All horses must be at least one year old.
- 8. Exhibitor and assistant should wear appropriate, tasteful attire. A safe costume or theme outfit is allowed for exhibitor and assistant only. The horse must be shown natural with no costume, no glitter, and no ribbons.
- 9. Entry will be disqualified if the horse falls during the performance.
- Entry will be disqualified if the horse leaves the ring during competition or catch time.

#### MH128 Costume Class

- 1. Class Specifications
  - a. Costume classes are to be judged 75% on originality of costume and 25% on presentation.
  - b. To be shown at a walk both ways of the arena and lined up in the middle of the arena for final judging.
- 2. Costume entries may be led, ridden, or driven and may utilize one or more handlers, horses and/or other animals.
- 3. Attendants 16 years of age and older may be allowed in the ring during Youth Costume classes. Attendant must not interfere or influence the individual's or equine's performance.
- 4. Costumes must be considered safe.

#### MH129 Versatility Class

- 1. The horse will be shown as a driving horse, in halter, and as a hunter, in that order. Once the horses come in to the line-up, grooms/headers are allowed in. At the end of the two minute period, grooms shall leave the arena with all tack and equipment. The horses will then be asked to follow the direction of the Ringmaster as they line up for the halter portion of the class. When their halter inspections are completed, they will again follow the Ringmaster in the same order and proceed over the hunter course. When all horses have completed the hunter course, they must trot for soundness before the judge(s).
- 2. All three portions of the class are to count equally.
- 3. Before competitors are allowed two minutes to un-tack and groom, it should be announced that horses are to remain in the same order as they go on the rail, both for the halter and hunter portions of the class.
- 4. Horses may not leave the arena between portions of the class.
- 5. The hunter requirements for judging, faults, elimination, and fences are to meet the same requirements as specified under MH128. There shall be two to four fences.
- 6. Horses must complete all three divisions, without disqualification, to be eligible for a ribbon.
- 7. Open to Pleasure, Country Pleasure, and Park horses.

#### MH130 Roman Chariot Event

- 1. General
  - a. This class is intended as a display of horsemanship. To be shown as a team of horses hitched to a Roman style chariot, with emphasis on the authenticity of the chariot, harness and drivers apparel.
  - b. There were several different types used for chariots in that era, such as fighting vehicles, racing, parades and transportation for royalty. Any of these themes may be used as a reenactment of this era.
  - c. The origin of parading of horses before a race or competition was said to have originated with the chariot horses at the time. Therefore, at the discretion of management and allotment of time, entries may be permitted to parade their horses and rigs in the arena before the beginning of the class. Banners, flags and capes, represent stables, sponsors, etc. may be displayed and carried by the drivers at this time. All entries may parade at this time at a collected trot only for the audience to inspect. The entries will exit the arena, shed their robes, banners, flags, etc. and will be ready for competition. No flags or banners are allowed in or around the arena at the time of
- 2. Horses are to enter the ring counter clockwise (to the right) at a collected trot. To be shown both ways of the arena at a collected trot, slow canter, hand gallop and walk. Horses to reverse at a walk on the diagonal. Horses must be called to a walk after a hand gallop and line up for final inspection. Header in at this time. Must stand quietly and are not required to back. To be judged 50% on manners and performance and 50% on fit and appropriateness of vehicle and harness, and overall appearance. Inappropriate attire to be severely penalized.
- 3. Gaits
  - a. Walk: A free, regular and forward moving four beat gait. Horses must appear calm and well mannered.
  - b. Collected trot: Horses to give an airy appearance while also showing that they have perfect manners, good mouths and under control at all times.
  - c. Slow Canter: Horses must demonstrate a slow canter in unison, be calm and light mouthed
  - d. Hand Gallop: Horses must do a hand gallop in unison, not at full speed or racing or giving the appearance of being out of control. Manners are most important at this gait and unruly horses or unsafe driving will result in disqualification.
- 4. Manners and safety are of utmost importance in this class. Judge may disqualify any entry that is deemed unsafe or unruly.
- 5. Drivers must be 16 years old or older.
- 6. Drivers may talk to their horse(s) as long as it does not interfere with other horses.

- 7. Horses in the team must show in the same gait (not one trotting and the other cantering or walking).
- 8. Horses may be light shod.
- 9. Open to 38" & Under. Class may be divided 34" & Under and 34" to 38" if four entries of each division are entered.
- 10. Headers are encouraged.
- 11. Equipment
  - a. Chariots must be safe and should resemble Roman chariots. Chariots deemed unsafe by Competition Management, Steward, or Judge may be disqualified.
  - b. No weapons allowed on the chariots, drivers or horses
  - c. Chariots and harness may have logos, farm names or sponsor names displayed.
  - d. Whips of appropriate size are permissible. No bullwhips, etc.
  - e. Open bridles are permissible. Side or over checks are permitted.
- 12. Only four chariots may be in the ring at one time and must stay well spaced and on the rail.
- 13. Judge may bring in the top qualifying chariots, four at a time for final workout.
- 14. Attire should resemble the Roman era and will be judged accordingly.
- 15. Single Roman Chariot
  - a. Chariot to be pulled by a single horse with class requirements and judging to be the same as the Roman Chariot hitch team specifications.
  - b. Drivers to be 13 years old and older.

#### MH131 Leadline

Horse to be 38" and under. Rider to be six years old or younger. Leader must be 16 years of age or older. Horse to be led both ways of the ring, line up, and stand quietly. To be judged on rider's ability to handle and aid the horse. Mares and geldings only. Entry is made in the name of the rider.

#### MH132 Specialty Classes

Specialty classes may be offered at a competition. If any of these classes are offered, a class description must be given in the prize list.

#### MH133 Showmanship

- 1. Exhibitors are to show to the presiding judge.
- 2. Only the handler is to be judged.
- 3. Management must choose and post the showmanship patterns. The pattern must be posted two hours prior to the start of the class.
- 4. Attire: Hat, boots, long sleeved shirt, and gloves are required.
- 5. Scoring
  - a. Appearance of Exhibitor: 10 points clothes and person should be neat and clean.
  - b. Appearance of Horse: 40 points conformation not to be a factor.
    - (1) 15 Points conditioning
    - (2) 15 points grooming of horse
    - (3) 5 points trimming
    - (4) 5 points tack
  - c. Showing horse in ring: 50 points. Judge will discuss the selected pattern with contestants prior to class.
  - d. Leading: 15 points
  - (1) Enter ring leading animal at an alert walk in a counter-clockwise direction. Walk on animal's left side, holding lead shank in right hand near halter. The remaining portion of the lead is held neatly and safely in left hand. Animal should lead readily at a walk. After Judge has lined up the class in front of spectators, the judge will call on each exhibitor individually to move his or her horse. When moving the horse, the Judge must get a clear, unobstructed view of the horse's action. The horse should be allowed sufficient lead to move freely the required distance, stop, and be turned to the right with the handler walking around the horse. Handler should perform the showmanship pattern as directed by the Judge or Ring Steward.

Presentation: 15 points

- (1) When presenting the horse, the handler should stand toward the front facing the horse, but always in a position where the handler can keep an eye on the Judge. Pose the horse with his feet squarely under him. Most of the showing should be done with the lead strap. It is forbidden to touch or kick the horse's leg into position. Crowding should be severely penalized and handler should maintain adequate space between his/her entry and surrounding entries. When Judge is observing other entries, the entry should stand in a relaxed manner, with handler in a state of awareness. Over and maneuvering are considered examples of showmanship faults.
- f. Poise, alertness, and merits: 20 points
  - (1) The handler should be aware of the position of the judge at all times and be careful not to become distracted by persons or things outside the ring. The animal must be ready to be shown at all times. Courtesy and sportsmanlike behavior must be exhibited at all times. Ideal showmanship performance consists of a poised, confident and appropriately attired exhibitor leading a well-groomed and conditioned horse that quickly and efficiently performs the requested pattern and maneuvers in a safe and efficient manner. A Judge may ask an exhibitor questions (Example: exhibitor number, horse's age, body parts of horse, etc.) At his/her discretion a Judge may ask an exhibitor for an additional test after completion of one of the three set patterns.
- 6. The half system method will be used. Exhibitor must be on the opposite half of the horse from the judge. When the judge is in position 1 then the exhibitor should be in position 1, when the judge is in position 2 then the exhibitor should be in position 2, etc.

#### Pattern #1

Walk to the Judge in a straight line. Stop and set up the horse. Upon acknowledgement from the judge, a 180 degree turn is performed. Trot in a straight line, past the line-up, stop. Do a 180 degree turn. Walk horse forward to the original place in the line-up (where you were when you started the pattern) and represent the horse.

#### Pattern #2

Walk toward the Judge in a straight line. Stop ½ way between the line-up and the Judge and do a 360 degree pivot and stop. All pivots are to be to the right. Continue at a walk (in a straight line) toward the judge. Stop and present the horse. Upon acknowledgement from the judge, do a 180 degree pivot. Trot in a straight line, past the line-up and stop. Do a 180 degree pivot. Walk horse forward to the original place in the line and represent the horse.

#### Pattern #3

Walk (in a straight line) to the judge, Stop and set up the horse. Upon acknowledgement from the judge, do a 180 degree pivot. All pivots are to be to the right. Trot (in a straight line) toward the line-up. Stop ½ way between the judge and the line-up and do a 360 degree pivot and stop. Continue at a trot in a straight line, past the line-up and stop. Do a 180 degree pivot. Walk horse forward to the to the original place in the line and represent the horse.

### MH134 Physically or Mentally Challenged (PMC) Classes

- 1. PMC classes may be split for Youth and Adults.
- 2. In order to show in the Physically/Mentally Challenged (PMC) Division, exhibitors must have a doctor diagnosed/permanent disability and have gone through the dispensation process as defined in GR1313. This rule also applies to Handlers. Exhibitors who are not disabled may not compete in these classes.

See GR1309.2a(5). Exception: Horses shown in any USEF Regular Competition prior to December 31, 1979, and Saddle bred-type ponies. The ASR will provide the Federation with a monthly report of affidavits filed in violation of this Article. A copy of the registration papers will be returned when exhibitors pick up their numbers, if requested. In the event a person files a false affidavit or an affidavit to show change of ownership or change of name without having taken steps to make the change with the ASHA, the Federation will levy a fine against that person in the amount of \$200. See GR1302.2a(5), GR907.3, and GR1309.2b. If the foregoing \$200 fine is not paid within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine, said person and any horses owned by him/her or his/her stable will be automatically suspended until the fine is paid. If the person disputes that the fine is not properly owing, he/she can request a hearing of these issues before the Hearing Committee provided a written statement specifying the grounds for the hearing is received at the Federation's office within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine. The request must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 made by a Federation member or the parent of a junior exhibitor member or \$200 if made by a nonmember (check payable to the Federation). Said deposit will be refunded in the event the hearing is resolved in the favor of the member/non-member.
- 3. Owners and trainers of horses participating at Federation licensed competitions rated "A" in all Saddlebred sections must be current members in good standing with the American Saddlebred Horse Association, Inc. or the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Canada and provide an original or copy of the ASHA or ASHA of Canada membership card unless the competition, at their discretion, confirms membership electronically with the ASHA or the ASHA of Canada office. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner need be a member.
  - a. If the ASHA membership card is not available, the exhibitor, or his or her agent, must sign the ASHA membership affidavit giving his or her name, address, the fact that he or she is in possession of the proper credentials and the reason the information is not available. In the event a person files a false affidavit to prove membership with the ASHA, the Federation will levy a fine against that person in the amount of \$200. See GR1302.2a(5), GR1302.2c, GR907.3, and GR1309.2b. If the foregoing \$200 fine is not paid within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine, said person and any horses owned by him/her or his/her stable will be automatically suspended until the fine is paid. If the person disputes that the fine is not properly owing, he/she can request a review of these issues before the Hearing Committee, provided a written statement specifying the grounds for the review is received at the Federation's office within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine. #### WL101 Eligibility

- 1. All *animals* ponies must be registered in the stud book of the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc. or the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of Canada and must be entered under their full registered name, or, if under one year, be eligible for registration.
- 2. A registered Welsh Pony, *Cob, or Half-Welsh* recorded with the Federation under a different name, must show in Welsh classes for high score award points under its *full* Welsh name. Welsh points will be awarded if its correct USEF registration number is used and its registered Welsh name is cross-referenced on the USEF certificate.
- 3. Registered Half-Welsh and Purebred Welsh may only show together in trail, equitation and carriage driving classes.
- 4. The Welsh Pony and Cob Division Rules are supplemented by the official Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc. Sanctioned Show Rules Book. Federation rules take precedence. It is the responsibility of judges, stewards, exhibitors and officials to comply with the criteria and intent of the WPCSA Sanctioned Show Rules Book. A current copy of the WPCSA Sanctioned Show Rules Book may be obtained from: WPCSA, 720 Green Street, Stephens City, VA 22655.
- 5. Before a pony may be issued a number or enter the ring, the Show Secretary must have a copy of the Welsh Certificate of Registration in the current owner's name. If the pony is under one year of age and not yet registered, submit a copy of dam's Certificate of Registration, the registration number and registered name of the sire and the proposed registration name of entry. *Unnamed foals may not be shown*.

#### WL102 Height

- 1. Whenever possible, classes should be divided by height. Section A ponies may not exceed 12.2 hands. Section B ponies may not exceed 14.2 hands. Section C, Welsh Pony of Cob Type, may not exceed 13.2 hands. Section D, Welsh Cob, exceeds 13.2 hands with no upper height limit. Measurements to be conducted per HU, HU169-HU180.
- 2. Management shall not permit an animal to be shown in any Welsh, *Half-Welsh*, *or Welsh Cob* performance class at a Federation Licensed Competition unless the person presenting the animal is in possession of one of the following:
- a. A measurement card issued by the Federation bearing the date of August 15, 1993 or thereafter; or
  - b. A certified measurement card applied for prior to December 1, 1987; or
  - c. a copy of a valid measurement form. Competition management may, at its discretion, confirm any of the foregoing information electronically with the Federation Office.
- 3. At Regular Competitions, management may not give out an exhibitor's number for an animal showing in a Welsh Pony, *Cob, or Half-Welsh* performance class before the above requirements have been complied with, and charges of rule violations for hearing and determination to Chapters GR6 and GR7 shall result for failure of compliance with this Rule.
- 4. Whenever possible, performance classes should be divided by height. Classes to be divided in to 12.2 hands and under, over 12.2 hands but not exceeding 14.2 hands
- 4. 5. Section A and Section B ponies may be shown together. unless there are (8) eight or more ponies of each height section, then the class must be split and the prize money doubled. Section C and Section D cobs may be shown together in breeding and performance classes.
  - a. Section C and Section D cobs may not be shown with Section A or Section B ponies except in the following classes:
    - (1) Welsh Trail
    - (2) Welsh Draft Harness Pony
    - (3) Welsh Carriage Driving
    - (4) Welsh Pony Leading Rein
    - (5) Welsh Child's First Pony
- 5. If there are eight or more of each section in a performance class, the class must be split and the prize money doubled.

#### WL103 Section A and Section B Type and Conformation.

- 1. The Welsh Pony is a strong, proud going pony and his competition ring training should be aimed at developing his natural and characteristic action to its best expression. Suitability of the pony and its action for the type of job at hand is essential. General character is hardy, spirited and pony-like.
- 2. Any color except piebald and skewbald; head small and clean cut, well set on and tapering to the muzzle, a slight dish is desirable; eyes bold, set wide apart, ears well-placed, small and pointed, well up on head, *proportionately close*; nostrils prominent *and open*; jaws and throat clean and finely cut. Neck shall be lengthy, well carried and moderately lean in the case of mares but inclined to be cresty in the case of *mature* stallions; shoulders long and sloping well back; withers moderately fine but not "knifey", the humerus upright so that the foreleg is not set in under the body. Forelegs should be set square and true, not tied in at the elbow, with long, strong forearms, well developed knee and short flat bone below. Back and loins should be muscular, strong and well-coupled; girth deep and ribs well-sprung; hindquarters lengthy and fine, not cobby, ragged or goose rumped, with tail well set on and carried gaily; the hindlegs should have large hocks, flat and clean with points prominent, to turn neither inward nor outward, the hindlegs not to be bent, hocks not to be set behind a line from the point of the quarter to the fetlock joint. Pasterns should have medium *proportionate* slope and length, feet well-shaped and round, hoofs dense.
- 3. Action should be quick, free, and straight from the shoulder, well away in front. Hocks should be well-flexed with straight and powerful leverage and well under the body.

## WL130 104 Section C and Section D Type and Conformation.

General Character. 1. The Welsh Cob is strong and proud going and his competition ring training should be aimed at developing his natural and characteristic action to its best expression. Suitability of the Cob and its action for the type of job at hand is essential.

2. Strong, hardy and active with pony character and as much substance as possible. Color: Any color except piebald or skewbald. Head: Full of quality and pony character. A coarse head and Roman nose is most objectionable. Eyes: Bold, prominent and set widely apart. Ears: Neat and well set. Neck: Lengthy and well carried. Moderately lean in the case of mares but inclined to be cresty in the case of mature stallions. Shoulders: Strong but well laid back. Forelegs: Set square and not tied in at the elbows. Long strong forearms. Knees well developed with an abundance of bone below them. Pasterns of proportionate slope and length. Feet well shaped. Hooves dense. When in the rough, a moderate quantity of silky feather is not objected to but coarse, wiry hair is a definite objection. Middlepiece: Back and loins, muscular, strong and well-coupled. Deep through the heart and well ribbed up. Hindquarters: Lengthy and strong. Ragged or drooping quarters are objectionable. Tail well set on. Hindlegs: Second thighs, strong and muscular. Hocks large, flat and clean, with points prominent, turning neither inward nor outward. The hindlegs must not be too bent and the hock not set behind a line falling from the point of the quarter to the fetlock joint. Pasterns of proportionate slope and length. Feet well shaped. Hooves dense. Action: Free, true and forceful. The knee should be bent and the whole foreleg should be extended straight from the shoulder and as far forward as possible in the trot. Hocks flexed under the body with straight and powerful leverage.

## WL104105 Artificial Appliances and Irritants.

Any pony, *Cob*, *or Half-Welsh* wearing turnbuckles, equipment or devices other than those permitted in specific classes and any pony, *Cob*, *or Half-Welsh* showing evidence of the use of ginger or other irritants to produce a higher tail carriage than the natural position shall be disqualified from the class in which it is competing.

## WL105106 Shoeing Regulations.

- 1. Ponies, *Cobs*, *and Half-Welsh* may be shown barefoot. Foals and yearlings must be shown barefoot. In Breeding classes when Two-Year-Olds are shod, the shoes must be unweighted and the foot natural with frog close to ground; pads and additional weight of any description shall disqualify. *In all classes the foot should be natural in appearance with the frog close to the ground*.
- 2. The length of toe for Section "A" and "B" ponies 12.2 hands and under must not exceed 4"; the shoe excluding nails but including pad must not weigh more than 10 oz. The length of toe for Section "B" ponies over 12.2 hands must not exceed 4" 4.5"; the shoe excluding nails including pads must not weigh more than 12 oz. These measurements and weights will in most cases be less depending on the actual size of a pony and the type of competition (See General Rules Chapter 5 and GR804.1.)
- 3. The length of the toe for Section "C" and "D" cobs must be proportional to the size of the animal. The shoe excluding nails but including pad must not weigh more than 18 oz. These measurements and weight will in most cases be less depending on the actual size of a Cob and the type of competition

#### WL106107 Ring Procedures.

- **1.** Only one person shall be allowed in the ring with each pony **animal** except in driving classes where each **pony animal** may be headed by one attendant properly attired. The attendant must take no action that would affect the performance of any **pony animal**.
- 2. Passengers are allowed in Driving Classes. Drivers under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.
- **3.** Assistance in showing from outside the ring is prohibited.
- **4.** Unruly ponies animals must be excused from the ring.
- 5. Exhibitors shall be suitably attired.
- 6. Judges must severely penalize any pony animal that shows any indication of instability or weakness or any evidence of labored action due to faulty conformation, training, long toes, heavy shoes or improper shoeing.
- 7. When ponies are shown standing, the toe of at least one hind foot should be no farther back than the point of the rump. Ponies are not to be stretched. When Cobs are shown standing, the toe of at least one hind foot should be no farther back than the point of the quarter. Stretched Cobs must be disqualified.
- 8. Courses for Trail classes must be posted near the in gate of the ring in which the classes are to be held at least one hour prior to the class.

#### WL107108 Attire (General).

1. In all elasses cases, handlers, riders and drivers should be appropriately attired. ("Short" shorts, bare midriffs and flimsy footwear are not acceptable). Those persons who, in the opinion of the judge, are inappropriately attired may be excused from the ring. Protective headgear may be worn in all classes without penalty. See GR801.

#### 2. Driving Attire and Appointments

- a. Gentlemen to wear suit or slacks and jacket, shirt, tie, hat, gloves, apron and carry a whip. Ladies to wear slacks, blouse and jacket or tailored suit or dress, hat, gloves and apron, whip must be carried.
- b. Junior and adults riding in the competition may wear riding clothes in driving classes but must have gloves, apron and whip.
- c. Failure to follow the above rules will be penalized.
- d. Period dress is allowed only in Antique Vehicle classes.
- e. NOTE: In case of extreme heat, jackets may be removed at the discretion of the judge. Appropriate rain gear is permissible.

### WL108 Driving Attire and Appointments.

Gentlemen to wear suit or slacks and jacket, shirt, tie, hat, gloves, apron and carry a whip. Ladies to wear slacks, blouse and jacket or tailored suit or dress, hat, gloves and apron, whip must be carried. Junior and adults riding in the competition may wear riding clothes in driving classes but must have gloves, apron and whip. Failure to follow the above rules will be penalized. Period dress is allowed only in Antique Vehicle classes. Drivers under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. Drivers may carry passengers. NOTE: In case of extreme heat, jackets may be removed at the discretion of the judge. Appropriate rain gear is permissible.

## WL109 Performance Championships.

- 1. When three or more classes are offered in a section, the Championship must be awarded on a point basis, using 5, 3, 2 and 1 values for first through fourth places.
- 2. Ribbons won in classes with specifications restricting ponies, *Cobs*, *or Half-Welsh* in any manner shall not count toward any Championship unless such classes are complementary and have the same conditions.
- 3. When a Championship is offered, management shall keep a score card of winnings throughout the competition which shall be prominently displayed. The Champion and Reserve titles shall be awarded to the two of the four ponies *animals* which have acquired the most points in Open Performance classes. In addition to these points, only these four ponies *animals* shall receive half points for ribbons won in Model Classes.
- 4. At the discretion of competition management, ties (except hunter) may either be settled by the flip of a coin or animals may be worked off on the rail using the same judging specifications as in the classes offered in the division. In case of a tie in the hunter division, the championship or reserve will be awarded to the animal that accumulated the most points over fences. If animals have an equal number of points over fences, they must be shown at a walk, trot and canter using the same judging specifications as in the classes offered in the division.

#### WL110 Model Classes.

- 1. A Model class open to all Section A and Section B Welsh ponies is prohibited. One may be offered, however, in each of the classifications listed below. The Model class must be offered in addition to the required number of the classes for the section and will receive half points. To be shown in halter or bridle without quarter boots. To be judged on type, conformation and finish. To be moved on the line.
- 2. A Model class open to all Welsh Cobs is prohibited. One may be offered, however, in each of the classifications listed below. The Model class must be offered in addition to the required number of classes for the section and will receive half points. To be shown in halter or bridle without quarter boots. To be judged on type, conformation and finish. To be moved on the line. Suitability to be emphasized in all classes.

## SUBCHAPTER WL-2 SECTIONS A AND B BREEDING CLASSES.

#### WL111 General.

- 1. Animals to enter at the beginning of the class at a trot, on the rail, in a clockwise direction. Animals will line up and will then be called to be judged individually. Ponies to be shown In-Hand at a walk and trot except in Group classes. To be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, quality and substance; 15% on way of going, disposition and manners.
- 2. Stallions three years old and over must have all the fully developed physical characteristics of a stallion. Mature stallions must be masculine in appearance. Any question in this regard shall be determined by the official veterinarian.
- 3. Ponies Animals must be serviceably sound, in good condition and well groomed. To be shown in halter or bridle. Transmissible weakness and unsoundness to be counted against in Breeding classes. If not shod, ponies should be appropriately trimmed. Judge must severely penalize any Cob that shows any indication of instability or weakness or any evidence of laboring action due to fault conformation, training, long toes, heavy shoes, or improper shoeing.
- 2. 4. Classes will be divided into A and B sections. Ponies will be shown in Section A or Section B based on their registration with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society. Section A and Section B ponies may not be shown together in breeding classes, however they may be shown together in performance and model classes.
- 5. To be shown in halter or bridle. Cob stallions may be shown in tack.

## 6. Turnout.

- a. Cobs may be shown with full, natural or evened mane. The entire mane may not be braided, however, one single braid behind the ear is permissible. Cobs may be presented in the manner they will show in performance classes that day.
- b. Cobs to be shown with tail unset and ungingered. A bridle path, if necessary, shall not exceed two inches. Any Cobs wearing spoon cruppers, quarter boots, humane tail braces, switches and wigs or any Cobs whose tails have been docked, nicked, gingered or put in a tail set for the class entered shall be disqualified.
- 8. No animal, except geldings, may be shown in a group class unless it is being shown in a single breeding class at the same competition. Sire and dam need not be present. Additional rules to be determined by the individual competitions.
- 9. Actual age to be taken into consideration in judging Cob foals and yearlings.
- 10. Emphasis for Cobs shall be on breed characteristics. Natural reaching action is desired.

#### WL112 Section A and Section B Junior and Senior Breeding Classes.

- 1. Junior Breeding Classes. Open to ponies two years old and under. Section A ponies are to wear natural, unbraided or evened mane and natural, unset, ungingered tail. The long hair of the ears may be clipped. Braiding is optional for Section B ponies. Actual age to be taken into consideration in judging foals and yearlings. Section A ponies are to wear natural, unbraided or evened mane and natural, unset, ungingered tail.
- 2. Senior Breeding Classes. Open to ponies three years old and over. Ponies may be presented in the same manner as they are in classes of the Welsh section in which they perform except that the length of the toe shall not exceed the maximum. (See WL106). However, any ponies wearing spoon cruppers, quarter boots, humane tail braces, switches and wigs or any ponies whose tails have been nicked, gingered or put in a tail set for the class entered shall be disqualified. Stallions may be shown in tack. Emphasis shall be on breed characteristics. Natural reaching action is desired.

## WL113 Senior Breeding Classes.

Open to ponies three years old and over. Ponies may be presented in the same manner as they are in classes of the Welsh section in which they perform except that the length of the toe shall not exceed the maximum. (See WL105). However, any ponies wearing spoon cruppers, quarter boots, humane tail braces, switches and wigs or any ponies whose tails have been nicked, gingered or put in a tail set for the class entered shall be disqualified. Stallions may be shown in tack. Emphasis shall be on breed characteristics. Natural reaching action is desired.

#### SUBCHAPTER WL-3 SECTIONS A AND B PERFORMANCE CLASSES.

#### WL115114 General.

- 1. Stallions may be shown in Ladies and Junior Exhibitor classes unless the prize list stipulated otherwise.
- 2. Classes for adult riders must be offered separately from those for junior riders. In all driving classes, Sections C and D classes, and Half-Welsh classes juniors and adults may compete together. Suitability is *essential and* to be emphasized in all classes.
- 3. Classes are open to stallions, mares and geldings. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, *movement* and style; 25% on breed type, conformation, quality and finish with emphasis in the order listed under recommended classes unless otherwise specified. Working classes are to be judged 100% on performance, *conformation not to count. See WPCSA Sanctioned Show Rules—Performance Division*.
- 4. To be eligible for any Stake class, an pony animal must have been entered, shown and judged in at least one qualifying class judged under the same specifications.
- 5. All Section A and Section B performance classes will be divided by height. Refer to WL102.21.
- 6. The Pleasure and Hunter sections for all sections and Half-Welsh may be divided by the riders' age as long as both complementary divisions are offered. The two age divisions are defined as riders 12 and under, and riders 13 to 17 years.
- 7. Two of the classes in each performance division must be judged as conformation classes. Exception: Carriage Driving.

#### WL116115 Qualifying Gaits.

[...

4. Gallop: Faster and lower to the ground than the canter.

#### WL117116 Welsh Pleasure Pony Section.

- 1. Ponies Animals to wear unset, ungingered tail. Hunter braiding is optional. Any animal wearing a spoon crupper, showing evidence of ginger or set tail shall be disqualified.
- 2. To be shown with a natural foot and unweighted shoes. Pads may be used but additional weight of any description is prohibited. Any *animal* pony wearing a spoon crupper, showing evidence of ginger or set tail, or whose feet and shoes exceed the limits as set forth in WL105106 shall be disqualified. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.
- 3. Up to three of the following tests may be chosen for use in any of the working classes. Judges may use their discretion. Adult classes may be asked to counter canter/lope or do turns on the forehand or haunches at the discretion of the show committee and/or judge.
  - a. Halt on rail
  - b. Halt on rail and back four steps
  - c. Canter/lope on correct lead from trot/jog
  - d. Canter/lope on correct lead from halt
  - e. Perform figure eight at the trot/jog. If riding English, the entrant will switch diagonals at the center of the figure.
  - f. Perform figure eight at the canter/lope demonstrating a simple change of lead at the center of the figure. (This is a change whereby the animal is brought back into a walk or trot/jog and restarted into a canter/lope on the opposite lead.
  - g. Side passes are an optional test for Western pleasure.
- 4. Tack
  - a. English Pleasure ponies, Cobs, and Half-Welsh to be shown in regulation snaffles, pelhams, or full bridles all with cavesson nosebands. Non-conventional bits or nosebands may be penalized at the judge's discretion.
  - b. Western
    - (1) Western ponies, Cobs, and Half-Welsh will show with a stock or side saddle, but silver equipment will not count over a good working outfit.
    - (2) Entries may use any standard Western bit. A standard Western bit is defined as having a shank with a maximum overall length of 8.5 inches. The mouthpiece will consist of a metal bar 3/8 inches to 3/4 inches varying from the straight bar to a full spade. Jointed mouthpieces are permitted.
    - (3) Entries may use a standard snaffle bit only if animals are five years old and under. A standard snaffle bit is defined as a center jointed single, rounded, unwrapped smooth mouthpiece of 3/8" to 3/4" in diameter metal as measured from ring to 1" in from the ring with a gradual decrease to the center of the snaffle. The rings may be from 2" to 4" outside diameter of either the loose type, eggbutt, dee or center mounted without cheeks. If a curb strap or chain is used, it must be attached below the reins. Also, it must lie flat, be at least ½" in width and have no wire, rawhide, or other substance used with it.

- 1
- (4) Hackamores are permitted in any class on animals five years old and under. A hackamore consists of a bosal round in shape and constructed of braided rawhide or leather and must have a flexible non-metallic core. Attached reins may be of hair, rope or leather. No other material of any kind is to be used in conjunction with a hackamore (i.e. steel, metal, or chains). (Exception: smooth plastic electrical tape is acceptable.)
- (5) A leather chin strap or curb chain is mandatory on any bit with a shank. The must lie flat and be at least ½" in width. Rolled leather chin straps or twisted curb chains are strictly prohibited. No wire, rawhide, metal or other substance may be used in conjunction with or as part of the leather chin strap or curb chain. Rounded, rolled, braided, or rawhide curb straps are prohibited.
- (6) Reins may be any standard Western rein; however, any rein design which increases the effect length of the shank of a standard Western bit is prohibited.
- (7) Only one hand may be used on the reins and hands may not be changed except to negotiate and obstacle in a trail class. Hand is to be around the reins. When using split reins, the ends are to fall on the side of your reining hand. One finger is permissible between the reins. When using romal reins or when ends split reins are held in the hand not being used for reining, no finger between reins is permissible. The positition of the hand not being used for reining is optional, but it should be kept free of the animal and equipment and helf in a relaxed manner. Reins are to be carried immediately above or slightly in front of the saddle horn. When hackamores or snaffle bits are used, rider may use both hands. Both hands must be visible to the judge.
- (8) Prohibited Bits/Equipment: roping bits with both reins connected to a single rein at center of cross bar; snaffle bits on any pony aged six or older; slip bits; gag bits; rigid donut mouthpiece bits; flat polo mouthpiece bits; hackamore bits; bosals on any pony aged six or older; cavesson type nosebands; martingales; tie does; bandages or boots of any type.
- 5. Attire to correspond with type of saddle used.
  - a. Western riders to wear a long-sleeved shirt or top with a visible collar. A zipper is permissible under the shirt post with the buttons or snaps being visible on the shirt post. A one piece long-sleeved equitation suit is acceptable provided it includes any type of collar. Trousers or pants are to be worn with a belt under the loops Riders to wear protective headgear (required for juniors) or western hats. Protective headgear need not be of western type. Boots of western style to be worn. Gloves and western chaps are strongly suggested. Spurs are optional. A vest, jacket, coat, and/or sweater may also be worn.
- 6. The Western pleasure pony, Cob, or Half-Welsh should move freely with a stride length that is appropriate to its type, conformation and structure. Movements of the animal should appear smooth and without effort. The animal should have a balanced, free flowing motion. The head and neck should be in a normal and relaxed position. The poll should be level with or slightly above the level of the withers. The face should not be carried behind the vertical, indication possible intimidation, nor should it be nosed out, as that gives the appearance of resistance. The head should be level, nose slightly ahead of the vertical with a pleasant expression and alert ears. The animal should work on a reasonably loose rein, be relaxed and respond readily to all the rider's cues. Transitions and extension or collection of gaits should be smooth and the animal should move at an even pace. Stops and turns should be smooth, balanced and collected. Maximum credit should be given to the even moving, balanced and willing animal in good condition that appears to be a pleasant to ride.
- 7. Western Pleasure Gaits
  - a. Walk: A natural, flat-footed, lateral four beat, ground covering gait. The walk should be free flowing, straight, and true. The stride should be of adequate length and is influenced by type, conformation, and size of the animal.
  - b. Jog: A two beat diagonal gait with the animal working from one pair of diagonals to the other. The jog should be smooth, balanced and straight. Knee action should not be high or over flexed. Animals walking behind and jogging in front are not performing the true gait. When extended the jog should be ground covering, free and easy.
  - c. Lope: A free moving, natural three beat gait that should appear smooth and relaxed. Animals moving in a four beat gait are not considered to be traveling in a correct lope. Excessive speed is to be penalized.
- 2—8. WELSH PLEASURE PONIES ENGLISH EQUIPMENT-CONFORMATION ENGLISH PLEASURE, WORKING ENGLISH PLEASURE, CONFORMATION ENGLISH PLEASURE STAKE. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter on light contact both ways of the ring without martingale. Animals are to be pleasurable and obedient with smooth transitions. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes to be judged 100% on performance. Penalties to be assessed for extreme speed, extreme laziness, resistance shown by not responding to the required gait or not backing in the lineup, excessive chewing, tongue lolling, sour ears, wringing tail, rearing, balking, breaking gait or changes leads unnecessarily, incomplete equipment or attire. Up to three tests may be asked for.

9. WELSH COB PLEASURE ENGLISH EQUIPMENT-CONFORMATION ENGLISH PLEASURE, WORKING ENGLISH PLEASURE, CONFORMATION ENGLISH PLEASURE STAKE. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter on light contact both ways of the ring without martingale. Animals are to be pleasurable and obedient with smooth transitions. To be judged 75% on manners, performance and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes to be judged 100% on performance. Penalties to be assessed for extreme speed, extreme laziness, resistance shown by not responding to the required gait or not backing in the lineup, excessive chewing, tongue lolling, sour ears, wringing tail, rearing, balking, breaking gait or changes leads unnecessarily, incomplete equipment or attire. Up to three tests may be asked for.

3 10. WELSH PLEASURE PONIES WESTERN EQUIPMENT-CONFORMATION WESTERN PLEASURE, WORKING WESTERN PLEASURE, CONFORMATION WESTERN PLEASURE STAKE. To be shown at a walk, jog-trot and lope both ways of the ring without a martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Conformation classes Tto be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; breed type and conformation 25%; appointments 10% (See Rules WS104 and WS105). Working classes to be judged 100% on performance. Up to three tests may be asked for in the working class (see WL117.3).

11. WELSH COB PLEASURE WESTERN EQUIPMENT-CONFORMATION WESTERN PLEASURE, WORKING WESTERN PLEASURE, CONFORMATION WESTERN PLEASURE STAKE. To be shown at a walk, jog-trot and lope both ways of the ring without a martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Conformation classes to be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; breed type and conformation 25%; appointments 10% (See Rules WS104 and WS105). Working classes to be judged 100% on performance. Up to three tests may be asked for in the working class (see WL141.3).

#### WL118117 Welsh Trail Ponies.

WELSH TRAIL −1. Class to be divided into Junior and Adult To Ride. Registered ponies, cobs, and Half Welsh are eligible to compete together.

2. Exhibitors may show in English or Western tack and attire. Attire should match the seat being to be ridden.

- 3. To be shown over and through a minimum of 6 obstacles and a maximum of eight obstacles, except in the case of damaged obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. Junior Exhibitors may not side pass or canter/lope over loose rails. To be judged on performance 100%. Penalties are assessed for fussiness, extreme tension, rearing; not changing leads, extra lead changes; spooking when carrying objects; refusals; failure to maintain gaits; off course will result in no score and elimination.
- 4. No animal may enter the trail course area until the course and judge are ready.
- 5. Riders will be permitted to inspect the course on foot during the judge's instructions prior to the start of the class.
- 6. Tests which may be required
  - a. Negotiating the gate
  - b. Carrying objects from one part of the arena to another
  - c. Riding through water
  - d. Riding over logs or simulated brush
  - e. Riding down into and up out of ditch without lunging
  - f. Crossing a bridge (no rocking or moving bridges permitted)
  - g. Backing through obstacles
  - h. Sidepassing
  - i. Mounting and dismounting from either side
  - j. Performing over any reasonable conditions encountered along the trail
- 7. Unnatural objects such as fire extinguishers, perforated plywood in water boxes, exotic animals or unsafe elements such as hay bales, should be avoided.

#### WL119118 Welsh Pleasure Driving Ponies.

- 1. To be shown to a suitable two- or four-wheeled vehicle, four-wheeled vehicle for Pairs but not a viceroy, racing sulky or Fine Harness rig.
- 2. Tack & Equipment
  - a. It is the driver's responsibility to see that the harness is in good condition, is clean and fits properly.
  - b. Bridles should fit snugly to prevent catching on the vehicle or other pieces of harness. A throatlatch and a noseband or cavesson are mandatory.

- c. Black harness is considered appropriate for painted vehicles and natural wood vehicles having black trim, i.e., shaft coverings, iron work, dash or upholstery. Brown or russet harness is considered appropriate on natural wood finished vehicles trimmed in brown or any child's conveyance.
- d. All metal furnishing should match, be secure and polished.
- e. Breast collars are appropriate with lightweight vehicles.
- f. Full collars are suggested for heavy carriages such as coaches, brakes, phaetons, dog carts, etc. A correctly fitting harness saddle is important for the comfort of the animal. A wider saddle is suggested for two-wheeled vehicles as more weight rests on the animal's back. Narrower saddles are more appropriate for four-wheeled vehicles.
- g. Martingales are permitted only if appropriate for a vehicle being used (i.e. standing martingales are only appropriate for a Stanhope Gig or George V. Phaeton). Side checks are optional in all pleasure driving classes. Overcheck not allowed in pleasure driving.
- h. Snaffle bits and other types of traditional driving bits are allowed. Bits may be covered with rubber or leather.
- i. An appropriate whip shall be carried at all times while driving. The thong on the whip must be long enough to reach the shoulder of the farthest animal. A driver not in compliance with the above shall be severely penalized.
- 3. Tying of tongue is prohibited.
- 4. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one or two handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing, but steady hand enabling a consistent feel with the animal's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one style over another.
- 5. Only the driver may handle the reins, whip or brake during a competition. The penalty for noncompliance is elimination. Drivers receiving outside assistance after the judging has begun will be disqualified at the judge's discretion unless that assistance has specifically been allowed (assistance of groom/passenger heading an animal).
- 6. Drivers and passengers should be dressed conservatively according to the style of the present day. Any attempt to introduce period costumes or gaudy trappings is discouraged. Gentlemen must wear a coat or jacket while appearing in any class unless excused from doing so by the judge. Ladies must wear a conservative dress, tailored suit or slacks. Floppy hats are discouraged. Unless otherwise specified, the driver shall wear a hat, an apron, and gloves. Sandals or other flimsy footwear are not acceptable. Drivers and passengers that are inappropriately attired may be penalized at the judge's discretion.
- 7. If shod, animals should be suitable shod for pleasure driving. Braiding of the mane is optional. Any mane, tail or fetlock trimming should conform to Welsh standards. Any application of artificial hair in the mane or tail is prohibited.
- 8. Excessive use of the voice, shouting, or whistling to the animal may be penalized at the judge's discretion. The driver should strive to control the animal's movements with minimum use of vocal aids. If necessary, it is permissible to talk to the animal in a subdued tone of voice. Cluck for starting, "walk on," "trot" and "whoa" are the more accepted terms.
- 9. Gaits.
  - a. Walk: a free, regular and unconstrained walk of moderate extension is required. The animals should walk energetically, but calmly, with even and determined pace.
  - b. Working Trot: This is a slower, more rounded pace than the trot on. The animals go forward freely and straight; engaging the hind legs with good hock action; on a taut, but light rein; the position being balanced and unconstrained. The steps should be as even as possible. The hind feet touch the ground in the foot prints of the forefeet. The degree of energy and impulsion displayed at the working trot denotes clearly the degree of suppleness and balance of the animal.
  - c. Trot-on: This is a clear, but not excessive, increase in pace and lengthening of stride while remaining well balanced and showing appropriate lateral flexion on turns. Light contact to be maintained. Excessive speed will be penalized.
- d. Halt: Animals and vehicle should be brought to a complete square stop without abruptness or veering. At the halt, animals should stand attentively, motionless and straight with the weight evenly distributed over all four legs and be ready to move off at the slightest indication from the driver.
- e. Rein back: defined as a backward movement in which the legs are raised and set down simultaneously in diagonal pairs with the hind legs remaining well in line. To be performed and judged in two parts:
  - (1) The animal must move backward at least four steps in an unhurried manner with head flexed and straight, pushing the carriage back evenly in a straight line. The driver should use quiet aids and light contact.
  - (2) Move forward willingly to former position using the same quiet aids.

- 10. Penalties may be assessed for the following:
  - a. Animal not on the bit or resisting the bit
  - b. Not demonstrating a variation in gaits.
  - c. Loss of collection and balance resulting from extreme speed
  - d. Sour ears, excessive chewing, wringing of the tail, rearing, balking
  - e. Pulling with the jaw and neck rather than leaning into the collar and allowing propulsion from the hind quarters
  - f. Resistance in the rein back indicated by raising the head and opening mouth.
- 11. CONFORMATION PLEASURE DRIVING, WORKING PLEASURE DRIVING, CONFORMATION PLEASURE DRIVING STAKE. To be shown to a suitable two- or four-wheeled vehicle, four-wheeled vehicle for Pairs but not a viceroy, racing sulky or Fine Harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, to back readily. Maiden ponies animals shall be asked to do a walk and working trot. Entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the arena at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute a figure eight. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.

#### WL120119 Welsh Roadster Pony Section.

- 1. At all speeds Roadster Ponies should work in form, with their chins set and their legs working beneath them, going collectedly. At the trot, a pony whose action features folding of the knees, flexing of the hocks, with straight true action of front legs and with hocks carried close together and with motions coordinated, is executing a balanced trot. Animation, brilliance and show ring presence should characterize the Roadster in working at a jog-trot or road gait. When asked to drive on, the pony must show speed and go in form. Pacey gaited or mixed gaited ponies shall be penalized.
- 1. 2. Ponies must be 12.2 Hands and under.
- 3. Ponies to wear long, natural mane and long, unset, ungingered tail. The foretop and first strand behind ear may be braided. To be shown with a natural foot with appropriate shoes for proper balance and speed. Quarter boots or bell boots may be worn. Any pony showing evidence of ginger or a set tail or whose feet and shoes exceed the limits as set forth in WL105 will be disqualified.
- 4. Harness, equipment, attire and procedure shall conform to the Roadster Division (Chapter RD) except round reins and round traces are optional.
- 2.—5. WELSH ROADSTERS PONIES TO BIKE-CONFORMATION ROADSTER TO BIKE, WORKING ROADSTER TO BIKE, CONFORMATION ROADSTER TO BIKE STAKE. To be shown to a miniature two-wheeled bike. Driver to wear stable colors. To be shown at a jogtrot, road gait and then at speed. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement, and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.

#### WL121120 Welsh Formal Driving Pony Section.

- 1. Ponies to wear long, natural mane and long, natural unset, ungingered tail. The foretop and first strand behind ears may be braided. The foot must be natural with unweighted shoes. Pads may be used but additional weight of any description is prohibited. Any pony wearing quarter boots, a spoon crupper, humane tail brace or false tail, showing evidence of ginger or a set tail or whose feet and shoes exceed the limits as set forth in WL105 shall be disqualified.
- 2. The foot must be natural with unweighted shoes. Pads may be used but additional weight of any description is prohibited. Any animal whose feet and shoes exceed the limits set forth in WL106 shall be disqualified.
- 3. To be shown to a suitable four-wheeled vehicle. Type of harness is optional but must include a cavesson.
- 4. Attire should be appropriate to the vehicle and match the time of day, bearing in mind that this is a formal class.
- 5. Penalties
  - a. Resistance on the rail or in the line-up
  - b. Fighting the bit, opening the mouth excessively, tossing of the head
  - c. Not performing the required gait
- 2. 6. WELSH FORMAL DRIVING PONIES-CONFORMATION FORMAL DRIVING, WORKING FORMAL DRIVING, CONFORMATION FORMAL DRIVING STAKE. To be shown both ways of the ring at animated, natural trot and animated walk. To stand quietly and, except for Tandems, to back readily. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Faulty or laboring action to be severely penalized.

### WL122121 Welsh Fine Harness Pony Section.

- 1. A Welsh Fine Harness Pony may be described as the "peacock" of the show ring. Its collected motion should be lofty, airy, balanced, and reaching. The pony should possess presence, elegance, and refinement, with energy directed toward animation rather than speed.
- 2. Open to Section A and Section B ponies only.
- 1.-2. Ponies to wear long, natural mane and long, unset, ungingered tail. The foretop and first strand behind the ears may be braided. A spoon crupper or humane tail brace and wig or switch are optional.
- 3. Hooves should not be excessively long and shoes should not be excessively heavy. Quarter boots may be worn.
- 4. To be shown to a viceroy or miniature fine harness rig. Light harness with snaffle bit and over check is required. Roadster type harness without thimbles should be used.
- 5. One attendant may head each entry, but may not interfere with the performance of the pony.
- 6. Ladies' attire should consist of a conservative dress, tailored suit or jacket with coordinating slacks, non-floppy hat, and gloves. Gentlemen should wear a suit or jacket with coordinating trousers, shirt, tie, hat, and gloves. A riding habit is acceptable. Driving apron and whip are optional, but should not be used in evening formal classes.
- 7. Penalties shall be assessed for:
  - a. Tossing the head, fighting the bit, carrying the head to one side, or opening the mouth
  - b. Bucking, rearing, balking, kicking
  - c. Resistance on the rail, in the line up, or while backing
  - d. Not performing the required gait
- 8. A pony suitable for open classes may not be suitable as a Ladies or Junior Exhibtor's fine harness entry.
- 2. 9. WELSH FINE HARNESS PONIES-CONFORMATION FINE HARNESS, WORKING FINE HARNESS, CONFORMATION FINE HARNESS STAKE. To enter the ring counterclockwise at a free animated park trot, work at an animated walk, reverse across the ring at the walk, and then work at the park trot. To be shown at a free animated park trot, eExtreme speed at the park trot to be penalized, and at an animated walk. To stand quietly and back readily. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.

#### WL123122 Welsh Draft Harness Pony Section.

- 1. Utilitarian usefulness is stressed for ponies animals, harness and wagon.
- 2. Ponies Animals to wear long natural mane and tail. Braiding with decorations optional. Tails not to be docked. Clipping of fetlocks optional. If shod, shoeing must conform with WL105106.
- 3. To be shown to a suitable four-wheeled vehicle except a cart may be used for singles and tandems. Heavy draft type harness with collars and breeching is required. Full harness and lead bars on lead teams optional. Pleasure-type harness with collars is not considered to be appropriate draft harness. In a single hitch, the point of the shafts should not extend in front of the chest where there is a risk of bit or rein catching. The animal should fit the harness and vehicle; one should not overwhelm the other.
- 4. Animals connected with other than a singletree, doubletree, neck yoke or spreader bar will be penalized.
- 5. No one may assist the driver in any way except in the event of an emergency. Passengers are permitted. Sections A, B, C and D may be combined within a hitch and within a class.
- 6. 12.2 hands and under and 12.2 to 14.2 hands may be combined within a hitch.
- 7. The following individual maneuvers that may be requested include:
  - a. One or two figures of eight, beginning and concluding at the center of each figure eight
  - b. Halt from a walk or trot, rein straight back four steps and move forward into the former position.
  - c. Swing (fan) to the right and to the left keeping the vehicle as stationary as possible while the front wheels are positioned between two pylons or markers.
  - d. Reverse and roll back on the rail in lieu of reversing on the diagonal.
- 8. Each entry much perform with responsiveness and maneuverability. Each pony on the rail must work uniformly with its mate and is expected to slightly lengthen its stride on the corners. The action should be prompt, spring and snappy with no visible sign of unsoundness.
- 9. All ponies showing evidence of lameness must be excused. 10. Each pony should have equal draft at either gait.
- 11. In a six pony hitch, front leaders, center swingers, and rear wheelers should graduate in size and be judge similarly to the four pony hitch.

- 3. 14.-WELSH DRAFT HARNESS PONIES-CONFORMATION DRAFT, CONFORMATION DRAFT STAKE. For Singles, Pairs, Tandem, Unicorn, four pony hitch, six pony animal hitch. To be shown both ways of the ring at a working trot and flat footed walk. To Halt, stand quietly and back readily. Individual maneuvers may be requested. To be judged 75% on manners, usability and performance; 25% on breed type, suitability and conformation. Fancy equipment not to count over a neat suitable working outfit.
- 15. WELSH DRAFT HARNESS WORKING DRAFT. For Singles, Pairs, Tandem, Unicorn, four animal hitch, six animal hitch. To be shown both ways of the ring at a working trot and flat footed walk. To Halt, stand quietly and back readily. Individual tests may be required. To be judged 100% on performance.

#### WL124123 Welsh Carriage Driving Section.

#### WL125124 Welsh Hunter and Jumper Pony Section.

- 1. The rules of the Open Hunter Pony Division and the Open Hunter Division shall apply to all Welsh Hunters <del>Ponies</del> except that breed type shall be considered in Conformation classes and stallions may be shown, and championships will be awarded based on WL109.
- 2. Braiding is optional. Animals to wear unset, ungingered tail. To be shown with a natural foot and unweighted shoes. Pads may be used but additional weight of any kind is prohibited.
- 3. Fence Heights.
  - a. In Hunter and Jumper classes Section A and Section B ponies not exceeding 13.2 hands shall jump 2', ponies exceeding
  - 13.2 hands shall jump 2'6". A course is a minimum of six fences with eight jumping efforts.
  - b. Fence heights for Section C's (not exceeding 13.2) shall be 2'0"; for Section D's exceeding 13.2 shall be 2'6".
  - c. Distances between fences (lines) should be set on multiples of 12'.
- 4. A course is a minimum of six fences with eight jumping efforts.
- 5. Junior riders in all classes cannot have reached their 18th birthday as outlined in General Rules, GR126.
- 2. 6. For "A" and "B" rated Hunter sections a competition must offer two Over Fences and one Under Saddle Class. Two of the performance classes must be judged 25% on conformation and breed type. *Under saddle classes to be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.* Minimum prize money for an "A" rated section is \$150 and for a "B" rated section is \$50. WELSH HUNTER PONY—WORKING HUNTER OVER FENCES, CONFORMATION HUNTER STAKE OVER FENCES, CONFORMATION HUNTER UNDER SADDLE.
- 3. 7. In the Conformation Hunter Under Saddle class, exhibitors may be required to hand gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight ponies animals at one time.
- 4. 8. Ponies Animals shown in a Welsh Hunter section may also be shown by an Adult in a Welsh Adult to Ride section at the same competition.
- 5. 9. Refer to HU135 for a list of faults scored according to the judge's opinion and depending on severity or division may be considered minor or major faults.
- 10. Suitability is determined by the height and weight of the rider as related to the size of the animal.

#### WL127126 Welsh Child's First Pony Class.

Open to Sections A, B, C and Half-Welsh. Mare or Gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors, at least four but not more than ten years of age. To be shown on light contact. Ponies to be shown at a walk and trot in both directions. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire. Ponies to be judged on performance and soundness. Conformation, way of going, manners, suitability and turnout to be emphasized. If entries are sufficient, classes may be divided 12 hands and under and over 12 hands but not exceeding 12.2 hands. *There are no restrictions on competing in other divisions or classes for the pony or rider.* 

#### SUBCHAPTER WL-4 SECTIONS C AND D WELSH COB.

#### WL128 Eligibility.

All must be registered in the Stud Book of the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc. or the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of Canada and must be entered under their full registered name, or, if under one year, be eligible for registration. Registered Half-Welsh and Purebred Welsh may only show together in trail, equitation, and carriage driving classes.

#### WL129 Height.

- 1. Whenever possible, classes should be divided by height. Classes to be divided into Section C, referred to as Welsh Pony of Cob Type not to exceed 13.2 hands and Section D, referred to as Welsh Cob exceeding 13.2 hands with no upper limit. Measurements to be conducted per Chapter HU, HU169 HU180.
- 2. Management shall not permit an animal to be shown in any Welsh Cob performance class at a Federation Licensed Competition unless the person presenting the animal is in possession of one of the following:
  - a. A measurement card issued by the Federation bearing the date of August 15, 1993 or thereafter; or
  - b. Certified measurement card applied for prior to December 1, 1987; or
  - e. A copy of a valid measurement form. Competition management may, at its discretion, confirm any of the foregoing information electronically with the Federation Office.
- 3. At Regular Competitions, management may not give out an exhibitor's number for an animal showing in a Welsh Pony performance class before the above requirements have been complied with, and charges of rule violations for hearing and determination to Chapters GR6 and GR7 shall result for failure of compliance with this Rule.
- 4. Section C and Section D cobs may be shown together in breeding and performance classes but may not be shown with Section A or Section B ponies.
  - a. Exceptions:
    - (1) Welsh Trail
    - (2) Welsh Draft Harness Pony
    - (3) Welsh Carriage Driving
    - (4) Welsh Pony Leading Rein
    - (5) Welsh Child's First Pony
- 5. If there are eight or more of each section in a performance class, the class must be split and the prize money doubled.

#### WL130 Type and Conformation.

General Character. Strong, hardy and active with pony character and as much substance as possible. Color: Any color except piebald or skewbald. Head: Full of quality and pony character. A coarse head and Roman nose is most objectionable. Eyes: Bold, prominent and set widely apart. Ears: Neat and well set. Neck: Lengthy and well carried. Moderately lean in the case of mares but inclined to be cresty in the case of stallions. Shoulders: Strong but well laid back. Forelegs: Set square and not tied in at the elbows. Long strong forearms. Knees well developed with an abundance of bone below them. Pasterns of proportionate slope and length. Feet well shaped. Hooves dense. A moderate quantity of silky feather is not objected to but coarse, wiry hair is a definite objection. Middlepiece: Back and loins, muscular, strong and well coupled. Deep through the heart and well ribbed up. Hindquarters: Lengthy and strong. Ragged or drooping quarters are objectionable. Tail well set on. Hindlegs: Second thighs, strong and muscular. Hocks large, flat and clean, with points prominent, turning neither inward nor outward. The hindlegs must not be too bent and the hock not set behind a line falling from the point of the quarter to the fetlock joint. Pasterns of proportionate slope and length. Feet well shaped. Hooves dense. Action: Free, true and forceful. The knee should be bent and the whole foreleg should be extended straight from the shoulder and as far forward as possible in the trot. Hocks flexed under the body with straight and powerful leverage.

#### WL131 Artificial Appliances and Irritants.

Any Cob wearing turnbuckles, equipment or devices other than those permitted in specific classes and any Cob showing evidence of the use of ginger or other irritants to produce a higher tail carriage than the natural position shall be disqualified from the class in which it is competing.

#### WL132 Shoeing Regulations.

Cobs may be shown barefoot. Foals and yearlings must be shown barefoot. In all classes the foot should be natural in appearance with the frog close to the ground. The length of the toe for Section "C" and "D" cobs must be proportional to the size of the animal. The shoe excluding nails but including pad must not weigh more than 18 oz. These measurements and weight will in most cases be less depending on the actual size of a Cob and the type of competition.

#### WL133 Ring Procedure.

- 1. Only one person shall be allowed in the ring with each Cob, except in driving classes where each Cob may be headed by one attendant, properly attired. The attendant must take no action that would affect the performance of any Cob.
- 2. Assistance in showing from outside the ring is prohibited.
- 3. Passengers are allowed in driving classes.
- 4. Unruly Cobs must be excused from the ring.
- 5. Judges must severely penalize any Cob that shows any indication of instability or weakness or any evidence of laboring action due to faulty conformation, training, long toes, heavy shoes, or improper shoeing.
- 6. When Cobs are shown standing, the toe of at least one hind foot should be no farther back than the point of the quarter. Stretched Cobs must be disqualified.

#### WL134 Attire (General).

In all cases, handlers, riders and drivers should be appropriately attired. Those persons who in the opinion of the judge are inappropriately attired, may be excused from the ring. Protective headgear may be worn in all classes without penalty. See General Rules, GR801.

#### WL135 Driving Attire and Appointments.

Gentlemen to wear suit or slacks and jacket, shirt, tie, hat, gloves, apron and carry a whip. Ladies to wear slacks, blouse and jacket or tailored suit or dress, hat, gloves and apron, and carry a whip. Junior and adults riding in the competition may wear riding clothes in driving classes but must have gloves, apron and whip. Failure to follow the above rules will be penalized. Period dress is allowed only in Antique Vehicle classes. Drivers under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. In case of extreme heat, jackets may be removed at the discretion of the judge. Appropriate rain gear is permissible.

#### WL136 Championships.

Ribbons won in classes restricting Cobs in any manner shall not count toward any Championship unless such classes are complementary and have the same conditions. When a Championship is offered, management shall keep a score card of winnings throughout the competition which shall be prominently displayed. The Champion and Reserve titles shall be awarded to the two of the four Cobs which have acquired the most points in Open Performance classes. In addition to these points, only these four Cobs shall receive half points for ribbons won in Model classes. In case of a tie, the Champion or Reserve shall be awarded to the Cob that has accumulated the highest number of points in performance classes. If the scores remain tied, the Champion or Reserve shall be worked off on the rail using the same judging specifications as in the Open classes.

#### SUBCHAPTER WL-5 SECTIONS C AND D WELSH COB BREEDING CLASSES.

#### WL137 General.

- 1. Cobs to be shown In Hand at a walk and trot except in group classes. Stallions three years old and over must have all the fully developed physical characteristics of a stallion. Mature stallions must be masculine in appearance. Any question in this regard shall be determined by the official veterinarian.
- 2. Cobs must be serviceably sound, in good condition and well groomed. To be shown in halter or bridle. Stallions may be shown in tack. Transmissible weakness or unsoundness to be counted against in Breeding classes. No Cob, except geldings, may be shown in a Group class unless it is being shown in a Singles Breeding class at the same competition. Actual age to be taken into consideration in judging foals and yearlings. Cobs may be shown with full, natural or evened mane. The entire mane may not be braided, however, one single braid behind the ear is permissible. Tail to be unset and ungingered. A bridle path, if necessary, shall not exceed two inches. Any Cobs wearing spoon cruppers, quarter boots, humane tail braces, switches and wigs or any Cobs whose tails have been docked, nicked, gingered or put in a tail set for the class entered shall be disqualified.

3. Emphasis shall be on breed characteristics. Natural reaching action is desired. To be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, quality and substance; 15% on way of going, disposition and manners.

#### WL138 Recommended Classes.

- 1. Filly foals; Yearling Fillies; Two-year-old Fillies; Junior Champion Filly.
- 2. Colt foals; Yearling Colts; Two-year-old Colts; Junior Champion Colt.
- 3. Three- and Four-year-old Mares; Broodmare Five and Over with foal in current year; Bred Mare Five and Over without foal in current year; Yeld mare Five and over; Senior Mare Champion.
- 4. Three- and Four-year-old Stallions; Stallions Five and Over, Senior Stallion Champion.
- 5. Grand Champion (Junior Champions and Reserves and Senior Champions and Reserves).
- 6. Supreme Champion (Grand Champions and Reserves from all sections).
- 7. Geldings Two and Under, Geldings Three and Over; Champion Gelding, Supreme Champion Gelding.
- 8. Get of Sire—three animals by the same sire, combined ownership permitted; Produce of Dam—two animals out of the same Dam, combined ownership permitted; Breeder's Herd—stallion and three mares, all the property of exhibitor, all to be Two year-olds and Over.
- 9. Show Champions and Reserve Champions shall be selected as outlined in GR810.3.
- 10. See WPCSA Sanctioned Show Rules Breed Division.

#### SUBCHAPTER WL-6 SECTION C AND D WELSH COB PERFORMANCE CLASSES.

#### WL139 General.

- 1. The Welsh Cob is strong and proud going and his competition ring training should be aimed at developing his natural and characteristic action to its best expression. Suitability of the Cob and its action for the type of job at hand is essential. Open to Stallions, Mares and Geldings.
- 2. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, and style; 25% on breed type, conformation, quality, and finish with emphasis in the order listed under recommended classes unless otherwise specified. Working classes are to be judged 100% on performance. See WPCSA Sanctioned Show Rules—Performance Division. Stallions may be shown in Ladies and Junior Exhibitor classes unless the prize list stipulates otherwise.
- 3. To be eligible for any Stake class, a Cob must have been entered, shown and judged in at least one qualifying class judged under the same specifications. When three or more classes are offered in a section, the Championship must be awarded on a point basis, using 5, 3, 2 and 1 values for first through fourth places.
- 4. A Model class open to all Welsh Cobs is prohibited. One may be offered, however, in each of the classifications listed below. The Model class must be offered in addition to the required number of classes for the section and will receive half points. To be shown in halter or bridle without quarter boots. To be judged on type, conformation and finish. To be moved on the line. Suitability to be emphasized in all classes.
- 5. If separate classes in the Section C and D Welsh Cob division are not offered for Junior and Adult riders, then they may show together. Juniors and Adults may also compete together in driving and Half-Welsh classes.

#### **WL140 Qualifying Gaits**

- 1. Walk: True, fast, flat-footed, elastic and showy.
- 2. Trot: Square, straight, open, reaching and powerful. Extreme speed penalized.
- 3. Canter: Smooth, slow, collected and straight on both leads.

#### WL141 Welsh Cob Pleasure Section.

- 1. Cobs to wear unset, ungingered tail. Hunter braiding is prohibited.
- 2. To be shown with a natural foot and unweighted shoes. Pads may be used but additional weight of any description is prohibited. Any Cob wearing a spoon crupper, showing evidence of ginger or set tail, or whose feet and shoes exceed the limits as set forth in WL132 shall be disqualified. To be judged 75% on manners, performance and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.
- 1. WELSH COB PLEASURE ENGLISH EQUIPMENT CONFORMATION ENGLISH PLEASURE, WORKING ENGLISH PLEASURE, CONFORMATION ENGLISH PLEASURE STAKE. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring without martingale. To be judged 75% on manners, performance and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.
- 2. WELSH COB PLEASURE WESTERN EQUIPMENT-CONFORMATION WESTERN PLEASURE, WORKING WESTERN PLEASURE, CONFORMATION WESTERN PLEASURE STAKE. To be shown at a walk, jog-trot and lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. To be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; breed type and conformation 25%; appointments 10% (See Rules WS104 and WS105).

WELSH COB TRAIL - Class to be divided into Junior and Adult to Ride. Sections A, B, C, D, and registered Half Welsh are eligible to compete together. Exhibitors may show in English or Western tack and attire. Attire should match the seat to be ridden. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, trot or jog and canter or lope. Junior Exhibitors may not side pass or canter/lope over loose rails. To be judged on performance 100%. Penalties are assessed for fussiness, extreme tension, rearing; not changing leads, extra lead changes; spooking when carrying objects; refusals; failure to maintain gaits; off course will result in no score and elimination.

#### WL143 Welsh Cob Pleasure Driving

CONFORMATION PLEASURE DRIVING, WORKING PLEASURE DRIVING, CONFORMATION PLEASURE DRIVING STAKE. To be shown to a suitable two- or four-wheeled vehicle, four-wheeled vehicle for Pairs but not a viceroy, racing sulky or Fine Harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, to back readily. Maiden Cobs shall be asked to do a walk and working trot.

#### WL144 Welsh Cob Formal Driving Section.

1.Cobs to wear long, natural mane and long, natural unset, ungingered tail. The foretop and first strand behind ears may be braided. The foot must be natural with unweighted shoes. Pads may be used but additional weight of any description is prohibited. Any Cob wearing quarter boots, a spoon crupper, humane tail brace or false tail or showing evidence of ginger or a set tail or whose feet and shoes exceed the limits as set forth in WL132 shall be disqualified. To be shown to a suitable fourwheeled vehicle. Type of harness is optional but must include a cavesson.

2. WELSH COB FORMAL DRIVING-CONFORMATION FORMAL DRIVING, WORKING FORMAL DRIVING, CONFORMATION FORMAL DRIVING STAKE. To be shown both ways of the ring at animated, natural trot and animated walk. To stand quietly and, except for Tandems, to back readily. To be judged 75% on performance, manners and style; 25% on breed type and conformation.

#### WL145 Welsh Cob Draft Harness Section

Utilitarian usefulness is stressed for Cobs, harness and wagon. Cobs to wear long natural mane and tail. Braiding with decorations optional. Tails not to be docked. Clipping of fetlocks optional. If shod, shoeing must conform with WL132. To be shown to a suitable four-wheeled vehicle except a cart may be used for singles and tandems. Heavy draft type harness with collars and breeching is required. Full harness and lead bars on lead teams optional. No one may assist the driver in any way except in the event of an emergency. Passengers are permitted. Sections A, B, C, D may be combined within a hitch and within a class. WELSH COB DRAFT HARNESS-CONFORMATION DRAFT, WORKING DRAFT, CONFORMATION DRAFT STAKE. Single and multiple hitches (2,3,4) may not compete together in the same class. Separate divisions may be offered for 2, 3, and 4 hitches. For Singles, Pairs, Tandem, Unicorn, four pony hitch, six pony hitch. To be shown both ways of the ring at a working trot and flat-footed walk. To halt, stand quietly and back readily. Individual maneuvers may be requested. To be judged 75% on manners, usability and performance; 25% on breed type, suitability and conformation. Fancy equipment not to count over a neat suitable working outfit.

#### WL146 Welsh Carriage Pleasure Driving Section.

Carriage Pleasure Driving classes held in the Welsh Division are to be conducted in accordance with Carriage Pleasure Driving Division-Chapter CP.

#### WL147 Welsh Cob Hunter and Jumper Section.

- 1. The rules of the Open Hunter Pony Division and the Open Hunter Division shall apply to all Welsh Hunter Cobs except that breed type shall be considered in Conformation classes and stallions may be shown. Braiding is optional.
- 2. Fence heights for Sections C and D cobs shall conform to the rules of the Open Hunter Pony Division except fence heights for Section C's (not exceeding 13.2) shall be 2'0"; for Section D's exceeding 13.2 shall be 2'6". A course is a minimum of six fences with eight jumping efforts.
- 3. WELSH COB HUNTER-WORKING HUNTER OVER FENCES, CONFORMATION HUNTER STAKE OVER FENCES, CONFORMATION HUNTER UNDER SADDLE. For "A" and "B" rated Hunter sections a competition must offer two Over Fences and one Under Saddle class. Two of the performance classes must be judged 25% on conformation. In the Conformation Hunter Under Saddle class, exhibitors may be required to hand gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight ponies at one time.
- 4. Refer to HU135 for a list of faults scored according to the judge's opinion and depending on severity or division may be considered minor or major faults.
