USHJA 2022 Young Jumper Championships Specifications

I. Eligibility

- A. The horse must be registered with the USHJA and recorded with the USEF pursuant to USEF GR1102, in good standing under USEF rules.
- B. All athletes must be a current active USEF and USHJA member in good standing from the time of application until conclusion of the event.
- C. Exception: Foreign residents and horses in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in the Championship.
- D. USHJA Zone HOTY bonus points will only be awarded if the owner is a current active USEF and USHJA member and the horse is recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA.
- E. The burden of proof of eligibility to compete will rest with the sole responsibility of the owner or the athlete, and not of the USHJA. The USHJA staff is not available to determine each horse or athlete's eligibility.
- F. For a horse to be eligible for the USHJA Young Jumper Championship an enrollment application must be completed during one of the three enrollment periods: Early, Middle, or Late.
- G. Horse must be age verified as required in accordance with the Federation Policies and Procedures (*JP117*).
- H. Age can be verified only through the following identifications documents: Registration Papers, Certificate of Pedigree, passport issued by a breed or sport horse registry approved by the Federation, or horse identification documents issued by a breed or sport registry approved by the Federation that states the registered name of the horse, the registry number of the horse and age.
- I. All horses must be microchipped.
- J. Horses who have qualified in their age category for a Young Jumper Championship outside the United States, e.g. the World Breeding Championship for Young Jumping Horses, the German Young Horse Championships, upon verification by USEF, will also be eligible to compete.

II. Jumping Sections

A horse must be enrolled to compete in the Championships. Enrollment fees are non-refundable.

Five, Six, Seven, and Eight Year Old Horses

Early Enrollment: January 1 – June 30 of the current competition year	\$150.00

III. U.S. Breeder and Owner Enrollment Incentive

The U.S. Breeder and Owner Enrollment Incentive is for breeders and owners enrolling three (3) or more horses that have been foaled in the United States.

- A. All breeders and owners participating in the Enrollment Incentive must provide proof that each horse was foaled in the USA.
- B. Horse eligibility verification include breed and sport horse documents that state the breeders or owners name and place of foaling.
- C. Enrollment fees shall belong to the declared horse and transferred with the horse should it be sold before the start of the Championship.
- D. Should a breeder sell a declared horse before the start of the Championship they will be entitled to replace that horse at the price that the horse was enrolled for. Example: If enrolled for \$75.00 the cost will be \$75.00. If enrolled as part of the first 3 horses the cost will be \$150.00
- E. Enrollment fees are cumulative and the breeder or owner of multiple horses regardless of which age category they are eligible for, will be included in the incentive rate schedule.
- F. All fees are non-refundable.

IV. Qualification

- A. Five, Six, and Seven Year Old horses will qualify for their respective Championship by competing in USHJA Young Jumper Championship Qualifying Classes for Five, Six, and Seven Year Old horses at USEF licensed competitions that are between January 1 **and 44 days prior to the start of the current year's Championship.**
- B. Eight Year Old horses will qualify for the Championship with one (1) clear rounds in classes at 1.30m or above held at USEF licensed competitions that are between January 1 **and 44 days prior to the start of the current year's Championship.**
- C. Four Year Old horses are not required to qualify, but all horses are required to meet the eligibility requirement
- D. **If a horse meets their age categories' qualifying after 44 days prior to the start of the current year's Championship and up to 24 hours prior to the horse inspection at the Championships, the owner/trainer of the horse must present a copy of the official results from the horse show that shows the qualifying class(es).**

V. General Information for the Championship Competition

- A. Separate championships will be held for Four, Five, Six, Seven, and Eight Year Old horses. Each Championship will take place over four **to five** days (rest day between the Second Qualifier and the Final). A Consolation Classic will be held for any horse not participating in the Final.

- B. All classes conducted under USEF rules for Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse (JP117).
 - 1. Four Year Old horses, see section X.
 - 2. Eight Year Old horses are not required to compete under USEF rules for Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse.
- C. Course designers are allowed a 5cm discrepancy in jump height for any course set for the Championships.
- D. All horses must be on the grounds 24 hours before the start of the competition. Championship horses must remain on the horse show grounds through the completion of the Championship.
- E. All horses must present at the horse inspection for soundness before the First Qualifier. The Top 15 horses of each age category must re-present before the Final.
- F. Horses competing in the Championship may not compete in any other classes at the host competition once they have passed the horse inspection until they have finished or withdrawn from the Championship.
- G. A negative Coggins, Passport, or registry papers is required for the horse inspection. Microchips will be scanned.
- H. Following the horse inspection, assigned back numbers must accompany the Championship horse at all times when out of the stall and visible on the stall door when in the stall.
- I. No horse that was eliminated in the First or Second Qualifier is eligible for the Final.
- J. If a horse is eliminated in the First Qualifier, they are still eligible to compete in the Second Qualifier and the Consolation Classic.
- K. If a horse competes in the First Qualifier and does not wish to compete in the Second Qualifier for any reason, that horse is still eligible to jump in the Consolation Classic.
- L. If a horse/athlete who has qualified for the Final elects not to continue to the Final, then they are eligible for the Consolation Classic.

VI. Scoring for Five, Six, Seven, and Eight Year Old Horses

- A. Faults will be carried from each round (First Qualifier, Second Qualifier, and first round of the Final) to determine Overall Standings.
- B. Cumulative faults from the First and Second Qualifier determine the Overall Standings going into the Final.
- C. The Top 15 horses, including ties, with the least amount of cumulative faults will return for the first round of the Final (Modified Table II 2a).
- D. Faults from the first round of the Final will be combined with cumulative faults for overall placings. All horses tied for first based on cumulative faults will jump off.
- E. Five Year Old ties below first will be broken by their time taken in the first round of the Final.
- F. Six, Seven, and Eight Year Old ties below first will be broken by their time taken in the Second Qualifier.
- G. Overall Standings after the Final will determine the overall winner and placings of each age category.

VII. Awards and Prize Money

For the Five, Six, Seven, and Eight Year Old Horses. Four Year Olds, see section XI.

1. Qualifiers conducted under Table II:
 - a. Blue ribbons to all clear rounds
 - b. Prize money will be evenly distributed between all clear rounds. *If there are no clear rounds, then no prize money will be given.*
2. Qualifiers conducted under Table II, Section 1:
 - a. Ribbons 1st – 10th
 - b. Prize money paid 1st – 10th as follows: 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
3. Final:
 - a. Cooler to Champion
 - b. Trophy to Champion and Reserve
 - c. Ribbons Champion – 10th
 - d. Prize money will be paid 1st - 10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4% 4%
 - e. U.S. Breeders Bonus Award – given to the breeder of the top finishing horse in each age category.
4. Consolation Classic:
 - a. Ribbons 1st – 10th
 - b. Prize money will be paid 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%

VIII. Breeder's Cup Awards

- A. Leading Young Jumper Awards
 - i. Best Young Horse – given to the winner of the overall for each age category.
 - ii. Best U.S. Bred Horse – given to the highest placed U.S. bred horse in each age category.
 - iii. Leading Owner – given to the owner with the highest placed horses across all age categories. If an owner has more than one horse in an age category, only their highest placed horse in the section will be considered.
 - iv. Leading U.S. Breeder – given to the U.S. breeder with the highest placed horses across all age categories. If a breeder has more than one horse in an age category, only their highest placed horse in the section will be considered.
- B. Breeder's Cup Perpetual Trophy
 - i. Given to the leading overall breeder based on money won from all their bred horses across all age categories.
 - ii. The Breeder's Cup Perpetual Trophy is open to all breeders regardless of registry or nationality.
- C. Overall Leading Breed Registry
 - i. Given to the leading breed registry based on registered horses and their placing in all classes for each age categories.
- D. U.S. Breeders Bonus Award – given to the breeder of the top finishing horse in each age category.

IX. National and Zone HOTY Bonus Points

National and Zone HOTY bonus points will be awarded in each phase of the Championship for the Five, Six, and Seven Year Old sections.

- A. For the First Qualifier, Second Qualifier, and Consolation Classic, points will be awarded as follows:

1 st	30 points
2 nd	25 points
3 rd	20 points
4 th	15 points
5 th	10 points
6 th	5 points

- B. For the Final, points will be awarded as follows:

1 st	60 points
2 nd	50 points
3 rd	40 points
4 th	30 points
5 th	20 points
6 th	10 points

X. Four Year Old Section – Style and Jumping Championship

Horses must be enrolled for the Style and Jumping Section at a fee of \$100. (See enrollment section). Each horse will be given three (3) minutes to flat (walk, trot, and canter) in the show ring before the start of the round. Horses will be scored in the First Qualifier and the Final on jumping penalties and style according to the scale below. Jumping and style points weighted equally, i.e., 50% jumping points, 50% style points. They are judged for style points by **designated style judge(s)**.

A. Tack & Equipment

- 1. Four Year Old horses are permitted to compete in standing or running martingales.**
- 2. The use of Draw Reins, German Martingales, Chambons, or any other unconventional equipment are not permitted when jumping on competition grounds after the horse inspection until the completion of the Four Year Old Final.**
- 3. Four Year Old horses must adhere to the boot specifications listed in the USEF Rulebook for Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse (JP117.2)**

- B. Warm Up class is not scored.

- C. First Qualifier and Final (All horses who competed in the First Qualifier are eligible for the Final)

1. Simple courses with one double combination.

a. First Qualifier height: 0.90m

b. Final height: 0.90-1.00m

c. Speed 300 m/m

d. Rounds conducted under Table II (Clear Round)

- e. **Dry Liverpool will be used as an option.**
 - f. Rounds will be scored on both jumping faults and style points
 - g. Simple changes are not penalized
2. The point structure is as follows:
 - a. Jumping Points:
 - i. Clear rounds – 10 points
 - ii. 1-6 penalties – 8 points
 - iii. 7-8 penalties – 6 points
 - iv. 9-12 penalties – 4 points
 - v. 13 penalties or more – 1 point
 - vi. Elimination or a non-start – 0 points
 - b. Style Points: 1-10 (10 being the highest) points will be awarded in each round based on the horse's use of the following:
 - i. Front end
 - ii. Back end
 - iii. Back
 - iv. Rideability
 - v. Instincts
 - vi. **Scope**
 - vii. **Movement**
 3. Champion and Reserve will be named according to total scores (Jumping and Style).
 4. Ties will be broken by the highest style score in the Final round (no Jump off). If a tie remains, then the highest Style combined score from the First Qualifier and the Final will determine the Champion and Reserve. Should a tie remain, the horses will remain tied.
- D. Awards:
1. First Qualifier:
 - a. Ribbons 1st – 10th
 - b. Prize money \$1,000 will be paid 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
 2. Final:
 - a. **Cooler to Champion**
 - b. Trophy to Champion and Reserve
 - c. Ribbons Champion – 10th
 - d. Prize money \$4,800 will be paid 1st -**10**th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
 - e. U.S. Breeders Bonus Award – **\$1,000** given to the breeder of the top finishing horse.

XI. Championship Schedule

A. Five Year Old Section

1. **Maximum number of horses per athlete: 3**
2. **All courses to include a Liverpool with water.**
3. **First Qualifier:**
 - a. **Start Order: random draw**
 - b. **Format: Table II (Clear Round)**

- c. Height: 1.15-1.20m
 - d. Speed: 350 m/min
 - e. Prize Money: \$2,000 distributed equally between all clear rounds. If there are no clear rounds, prize money will not be given.
4. Second Qualifier:
- a. Start Order: reverse order from the First Qualifier.
 - b. Format: Table II (Clear Round)
 - c. Height: 1.20m
 - d. Speed: 350 m/min
 - e. Prize Money: \$2,000 distributed equally between all clear rounds. If there are no clear rounds, prize money will not be given.
5. Final:
- a. Top 15 horses, including ties, based on overall standings. Cumulative faults will be added to faults incurred over the first round of the Final. Ties for first place based on lowest overall faults (First Qualifier, Second Qualifier, and first round of the Final) will jump off. Ties below first will be broken by the time taken in the first round of the Final.
 - b. Start Order: random draw
 - c. Format: Modified Table II 2.a
 - d. Height: 1.20m
 - e. Speed: 350 m/min
 - f. Prize Money: \$12,000 distributed 1st - 10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
 - g. U.S. Breeders Bonus: \$1,500 to the top finishing U.S. Breeder
6. Consolation Classic
- a. Open to horses who competed in the First, Second, or both Qualifiers that did not qualify for the Final, and horses who qualified for the Final but choose to compete in the Consolation Classic. All horses will start equal. Horses must complete the course in order to place.
 - b. Start Order: random draw
 - c. Format: Table II 2.a
 - d. Height: 1.15-1.20m
 - e. Speed: 350 m/min
 - f. Prize Money: \$1,000 distributed 1st-10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%

B. Six Year Old Section

- 1. Maximum number of horses per athlete: 3
- 2. First Qualifier:
 - a. Start Order: random draw
 - b. Format: Table II (Clear Round)

- c. Height: 1.25-1.30m
 - d. Speed: 350 m/min
 - e. Prize Money: \$2,500 distributed equally between all clear rounds. If there are no clear rounds, prize money will not be given.
3. Second Qualifier:
- a. Start Order: reverse order from the First Qualifier.
 - b. Optional Water Jump: water may not exceed 3.35m (11') with a rail.
 - c. Format: Table II, Section 1
 - d. Height: 1.30m
 - e. Speed: 350 m/min
 - f. Prize Money: \$2,500 distributed 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
4. Final:
- a. Top 15 horses, including ties, based on overall standings. Cumulative faults will be added to faults incurred over the first round of the Final. Ties for first place based on lowest overall faults (First Qualifier, Second Qualifier, and first round of the Final) will jump off. Ties below first will be broken by the time taken in the Second Qualifier.
 - b. Start Order: reverse order of overall standings. Horse with the lowest cumulative faults jumps last. Ties will start in the order based on their time taken from the Second Qualifier.
 - c. Optional Water Jump: water may not exceed 3.35m (11') with a rail.
 - d. Format: Modified Table II 2.a
 - e. Height: 1.30m
 - f. Speed: 350 m/min
 - g. Prize Money: \$14,400 distributed 1st - 10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
 - h. U.S. Breeders Bonus: \$2,000 to the top finishing U.S. Breeder
5. Consolation Classic
- a. Open to horses who competed in the First, Second, or both Qualifiers that did not qualify for the Final, and horses who qualified for the Final but choose to compete in the Consolation Classic. All horses will start equal. Horses must complete the course in order to place.
 - b. Start Order: random draw
 - c. Format: Table II 2.a
 - d. Height: 1.25-1.30m
 - e. Speed: 350 m/min
 - f. Prize Money: \$1,000 distributed 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%

C. Seven Year Old Section

1. Maximum number of horses per athlete: 3
2. First Qualifier:
 - a. Start Order: random draw
 - b. Format: Table II (Clear Round)
 - c. Height: 1.30-1.35m
 - d. Speed: 350 m/min
 - e. Prize Money: \$3,000 distributed equally between all clear rounds. If there are no clear rounds, prize money will not be given.
3. Second Qualifier:
 - a. Start Order: reverse order from the First Qualifier.
 - b. Optional Water Jump: water may not exceed 3.35m (11').
 - c. Format: Table II, Section 1
 - d. Height: 1.35m
 - e. Speed: 350 m/min
 - f. Prize Money: \$3,000 distributed 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
4. Final:
 - a. Top 15 horses, including ties, based on overall standings. Cumulative faults will be added to faults incurred over the first round of the Final. Ties for first place based on lowest overall faults (First Qualifier, Second Qualifier, and first round of the Final) will jump off. Ties below first will be broken by the time taken in the Second Qualifier.
 - b. Start Order: reverse order of overall standings. Horse with the lowest cumulative faults jumps last. Ties will start in the order based on their time taken from the Second Qualifier.
 - c. Optional Water Jump: water may not exceed 3.35m (11').
 - d. Format: Modified Table II 2.a
 - e. Height: 1.35m
 - f. Speed: 350 m/min
 - g. Prize Money: \$18,000 distributed 1st - 10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
 - h. U.S. Breeders Bonus: \$2,500 to the top finishing U.S. Breeder
5. Consolation Classic
 - a. Open to horses who competed in the First, Second, or both Qualifiers that did not qualify for the Final, and horses who qualified for the Final but choose to compete in the Consolation Classic. All horses will start equal. Horses must complete the course in order to place.
 - b. Start Order: random draw
 - c. Format: Table II 2.a
 - d. Height: 1.30-1.35m

- e. Speed: 350 m/min
- f. Prize Money: \$1,000 distributed 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%

D. Eight Year Old Section

1. Maximum number of horses per athlete: 3
2. First Qualifier:
 - a. Start Order: random draw
 - b. Format: Table II (Clear Round)
 - c. Height: 1.35-1.40m
 - d. Speed: 350 m/min
 - e. Prize Money: \$3,000 distributed equally between all clear rounds. If there are no clear rounds, prize money will not be given.
3. Second Qualifier:
 - a. Start Order: reverse order from the First Qualifier.
 - b. Optional Water Jump: water may not exceed 3.35m (11').
 - c. Format: Table II, Section 1
 - d. Height: 1.40m
 - e. Speed: 350 m/min
 - f. Prize Money: \$3,000 distributed 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
4. Final:
 - a. Top 15 horses, including ties, based on overall standings. Cumulative faults will be added to faults incurred over the first round of the Final. Ties for first place based on lowest overall faults (First Qualifier, Second Qualifier, and first round of the Final) will jump off. Ties below first will be broken by the time taken in the Second Qualifier.
 - b. Start Order: reverse order of overall standings. Horse with the lowest cumulative faults jumps last. Ties will start in the order based on their time taken from the Second Qualifier.
 - c. Optional Water Jump: water may not exceed 3.35m (11').
 - d. Format: Modified Table II 2.a
 - e. Height: 1.40-1.45m
 - f. Speed: 350 m/min
 - g. Prize Money: \$18,000 distributed 1st - 10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%
 - h. U.S. Breeders Bonus: \$2,500 to the top finishing U.S. Breeder
5. Consolation Classic
 - a. Open to horses who competed in the First, Second, or both Qualifiers that did not qualify for the Final, and horses who qualified for the Final but choose to

compete in the Consolation Classic. All horses will start equal. Horses must complete the course in order to place.

- b. Start Order: random draw
- c. Format: Table II 2.a
- d. Height: 1.35-1.40m
- e. Speed: 350 m/min
- f. Prize Money: \$1,000 distributed 1st–10th as follows; 30%, 20%, 12%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 4%, 4%

XII. USHJA Young Jumper Championships – Organizer Requirements

- A. Organizer must hire one large ‘R’ Jumper licensed judge and one style judge from a pre-approved list provided. If a desired style judge is not listed, then management must request approval of a different style judge from the USHJA Young Jumper Task Force.
- B. There will be a rest day between Second Qualifier and the Final.
- C. Every Championship must have a non-judged Warm-Up Class. The course of 9 efforts and will include a water jump with a rail, and the width of the water is not to exceed 3.35m (11’). Fence height will be at or below the height of each age category’s First Qualifier.
- D. Warm Up Class must be held in the same ring as the First Qualifier for each age category
- E. Course designers are allowed a 5cm discrepancy in jump height for any course set for the Championships.
- F. An optional water jump must be included in the Second Qualifier for the Six and Seven Year Old sections, the water may not exceed 3.35m (11’) and must use a rail over the water with a lath on the landing. For the Eight Year Old section, the water will be used as an open water. The water must be set as an option fence and must be set going toward the in gate.
- G. Only 3 horses per athlete allowed in each age category.
- H. Speed for all classes set at 350m per minute, except the Four Year Old section will be set at 300m per minute.
- I. All classes conducted under USEF rules for Young Jumpers. Exception: Eight Year Olds will follow USEF Jumper Rules.

The USHJA Young Jumper Championships and the related format and specifications are the sole properties of the USHJA and may only be held, conducted or used upon the terms and conditions specified by the USHJA. USHJA reserves the right to change language in documents related to the conduct of the USHJA Young Jumper Championships as necessary for the purposes of consistency and clarity. Any deviations from the class specifications for the USHJA Young Jumper Championships are not permitted without the express written permission from USHJA prior to the printing of the prize list. For any rules not specified above, please refer to the current USEF Rule Book.
